ing the wall built on his property. He stated that he intends to build an additional apartment unit soon and that the wall should be considered as part of the new unit. The building committee will deal with the matter when a building permit is applied for.

A quotation of \$2,735 per month was received from R.T. Yates covering the collection of refuse within the township. The property committee will meet with him to discuss various items of the contract.

A quotation received from Miss A. Ross to provide two handpainted signs displaying the township logo and suitable for use as highway signs was accepted. \$350 per sign will be paid and the township is to supply the plywood.

The council had no objections to an application for severance made by Mrs. C. St. Jean. Permission must be received for the proposed access road and the township will not be faced with additional costs if an alternative is found necessary.

Approval of an application for severance from CP Rail was withheld pending an investigation by the town clerk. The application covers

property located at Ontario Street and highway 17, now presently leased to Mrs. E. Nesbitt. Council voiced concern that the area be serviced with a public


Councillor E. Borutski was authorized by council to sign the agreement covering the operation of the Water Treatment Plant by the Ministry of the Environment.

The Council resolved to support a resolution of the City of Timmins which protests a proposed 9.2 per cent rate increase in Hydro rates applied for by Ontario Hydro.

Another resolution was passed to allow general accounts to the amount of \$27,016.25 and Water Works accounts to the amount of \$10,200.47 to be paid and that all cheques issued since July 10, 1984 be ratified.

By-Law 769, a by-law to expropriate certain lands in the R-270 area, more particularly described as Part 3, of Reference Plan 55R-5776, was carried.

The Township of Schreiber will purchase the area of property adjacent to the subway, now leased from Marathon Realty, the final price subject to negotiation.

The purpose of the Inquiry is to obtain the public's participation in the development of a proposed regulatory and administrative program to effectively deal with the establishment and operation of mobile PCB destruction facilities on temporary sites at various locations within the Province of Ontario, so that the Commission can make recommendations concerning the proposed program to the Minister of the Environment.

THE MINISTRY OF THE ENVIRONMENT'S PROPOSED REGULA-TORY PROGRAM WOULD REPLACE THE EXISTING REQUIRE-MENTS FOR SITE-SPECIFIC HEARINGS FOR THE LOCATION OF THESE FACILITIES AND THERE WOULD BE NO FURTHER HEARINGS IF THE PROPOSED REGULATORY AND ADMINIS-TRATIVE PROGRAM SHOULD BE ADOPTED.

At the Preliminary Hearings the Commission will deal with matters relating to, but not necessarily restricted to:

- (a) the identification of all interested persons who intend to make representations;
- (b) the identification of issues;
- (c) the setting of locations for the Public Hearings;

No evidence will be received at the Preliminary Hearings. Copies of the Rules of Procedure to be followed, including the Criteria for the Award of Funds, will be available at the Preliminary Hearings. Copies of the Ministry's proposal (as revised since May 22, 1984) will be available for distribution on September 17, 1984, and will be in the hands of all parties identified at the Preliminary Hearings by September 21, 1984.

THE MINISTRY OF THE ENVIRONMENT WILL BE MAKING ITS PRESENTATION OF THE PROPOSED PROGRAM AT THE TORONTO LOCATION ONLY. Immediately following the Ministry's presentation, the Commission will begin to receive evidence from others at Toronto with respect to this proposal. Additional hearings to receive further evidence will be held in other locations to be determined, and the public will receive further notice of these hearings. Copies of the Ministry's revised proposal will be sent to interested persons identified at the preliminary hearings or who have completed and returned the attached form.

The Commission will not consider any submissions regarding the proposal after the conclusion of all the hearings.

Limited funding may be made available to those persons or organizations who require assistance and meet the criteria established for the award of funds. Application forms for funding and a list of criteria may be obtained upon request. Funding applications must be filed by October 1, 1984.

Copies of the Ministry's proposal, as issued for public comment on May 22, 1984, are available for examination and inspection at the office of the clerk of every municipality; at every District Office of the Ministry of the Environment; at the main branch of the public library in the location of each Preliminary Hearing, and at the Office of the Commission on the Regulatory Control of Mobile PCB Destruction Facilities, 5th Floor, 1 St. Clair Avenue West, Toronto, Ontario.

To assist the Commission with scheduling, all interested persons are encouraged to complete and return the attached form, indicating the level of their participation by checking the appropriate box.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Ontario Ministry of the Environment plans to introduce proposals to regulate the operation and siting of mobile, polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) destruction facilities.

PCBs are a class of synthetic organic chemicals that do not decompose easily and which accumulate in living organisms. There is a growing inventory of these wastes in storage because there are no currently approved destruction facilities in Canada. Mobile destruction facilities may be brought to any Ontario community to destroy PCB wastes without further hearings if the proposed regulatory and administrative program is adopted. The regulatory proposals set out the requirements under which mobile PCB destruction facilities will be permitted to locate and operate in communities in Ontario.

If the proposed regulatory program is adopted, it would still be necessary for the proponent of a mobile PCB destruction facility to make application to the Ministry of the Environment for a Certificate of Approval. If the Ministry should find that the proponent meets the requirements of the regulatory program, a Certificate of Approval would be issued without a public hearing.
