Over 8,000 health care detectives will join together to celebrate the first Medical Laboratory Technology Week in Ontario during the week of August 20 to 26.

Sponsored by the Ontario Society of Medical Technologists, the week will present an opportunity for the public to become more aware of the vital role played by these health care professionals in the diagnosis and treatment of disease. Throughout the province there will be displays in malls, hospital lobbies and waiting rooms, and open houses

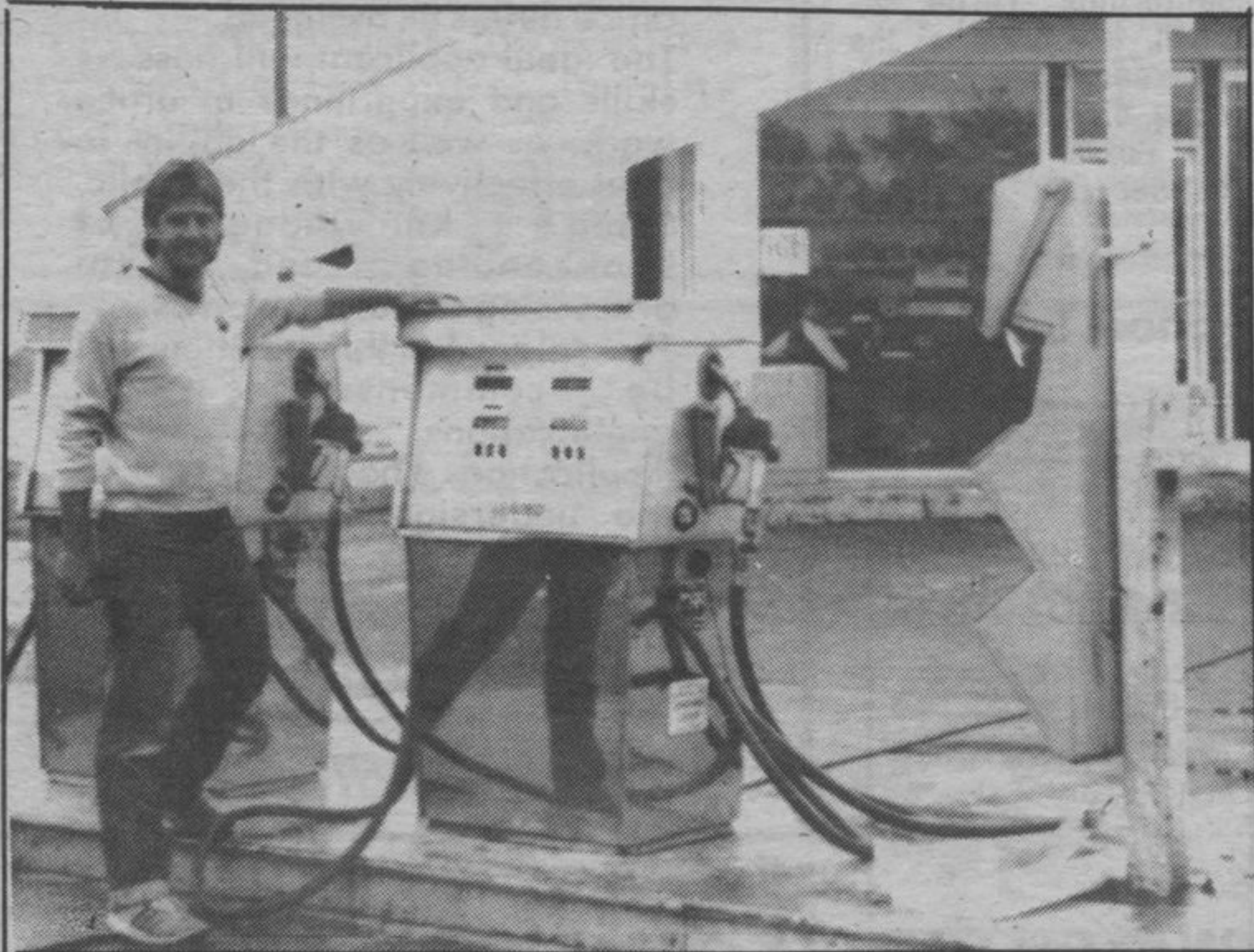
in laboratories.

"The role of medical laboratory technologists in the health care team is sometimes forgotten because of the little exposure between patients and laboratory staff," explains O.S.M.T. President, Sheila Woodcock. "Few people are directly exposed to the laboratory situation. They may have their blood taken 'for testing', but have no idea what happens to their precious specimen or what complex testing is performed to produce results which many mean the difference between life and

death."

By opening laboratories for public inspection the Society hopes that a greater understanding of health detective's role can be developed. Using a wide variety of instruments and techniques under rigorously controlled conditions, technologists routinely aid physicians in establishing their diagnoses and monitor the progress of patients during the course of their illness.
