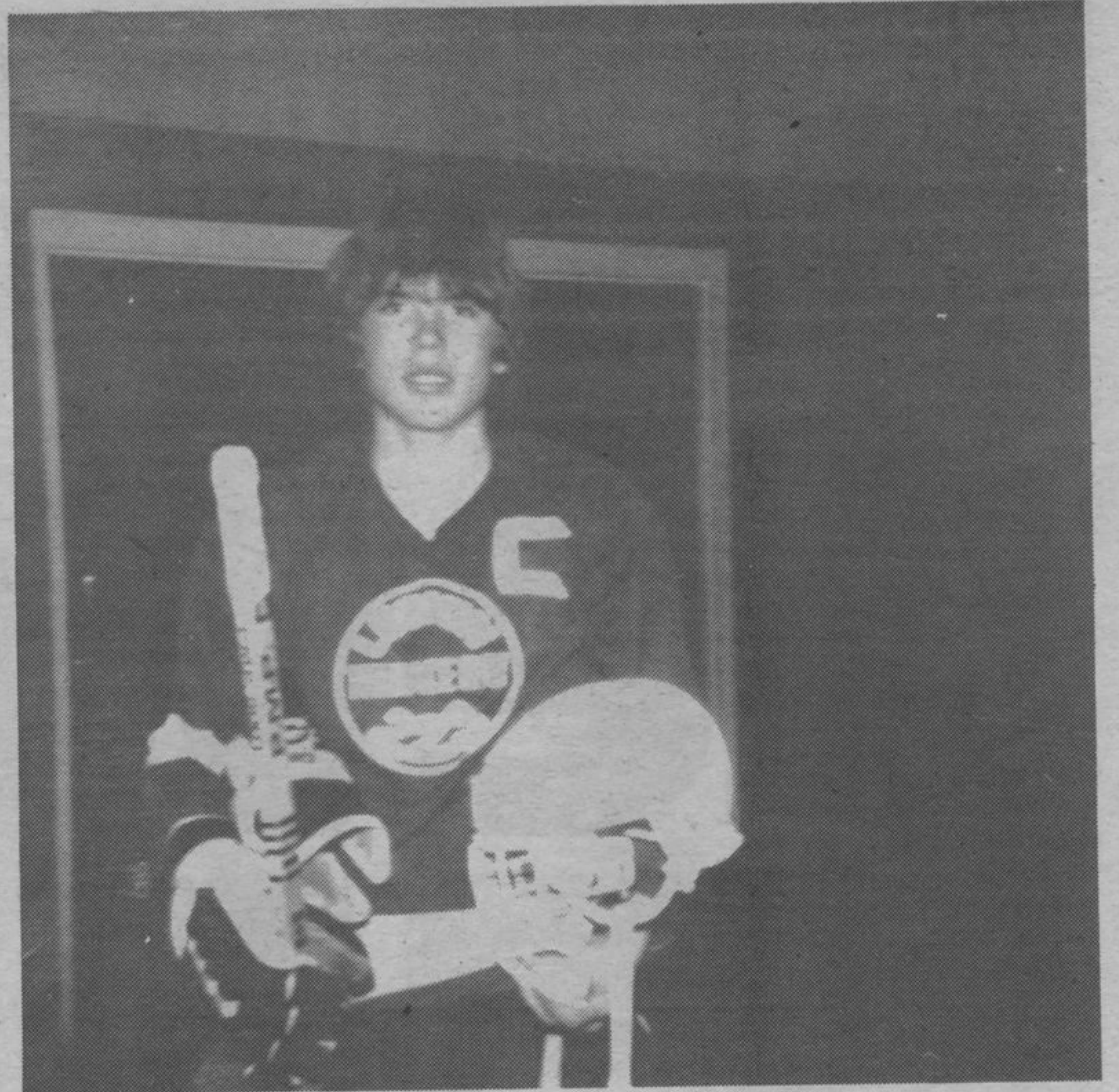
## Good Luck Richard!!

## Spruce budworm

**Spruce Budworm.** You may have wondered what those strange little fellows were that dangled from silken threads from our conifer trees in the early part of the summer. This same insect becomes a small brown moth, which dies off after it lays its eggs in mid-August, littering our beaches and emanating a stench somewhat akin to dead fish. This is the spruce budworm. The female moth lays her eggs at the end of the summer. When they hatch, the larvae set to work constructing hiber-

nation shelters in the crevices of bark or twigs. They stay in their shelters until the warm days of spring entice them out. They emerge hungry, and make quick work of the buds and new shoots around them. Spruce budworm has a preference for balsam fir, white spruce, and to a lesser extent, black spruce and jack-pine. Their damage is easily seen.

In heavily infested areas, these trees will take on a reddish cast. After 3-5 years of severe defoliation, the weaker trees will start to die.

After the larvae needs are satisfied, the budworm enters the pupal stage for 10 days and emerges a relatively unattractive small, mottled, brown moth. The life cycle continues. Although the Spruce Budworm is often refer-

red to as a "pest that plagues Canada's Boreal Forest," we must recognize it as an important component of this community which contributes to the fine balance between disturbance and regeneration.
