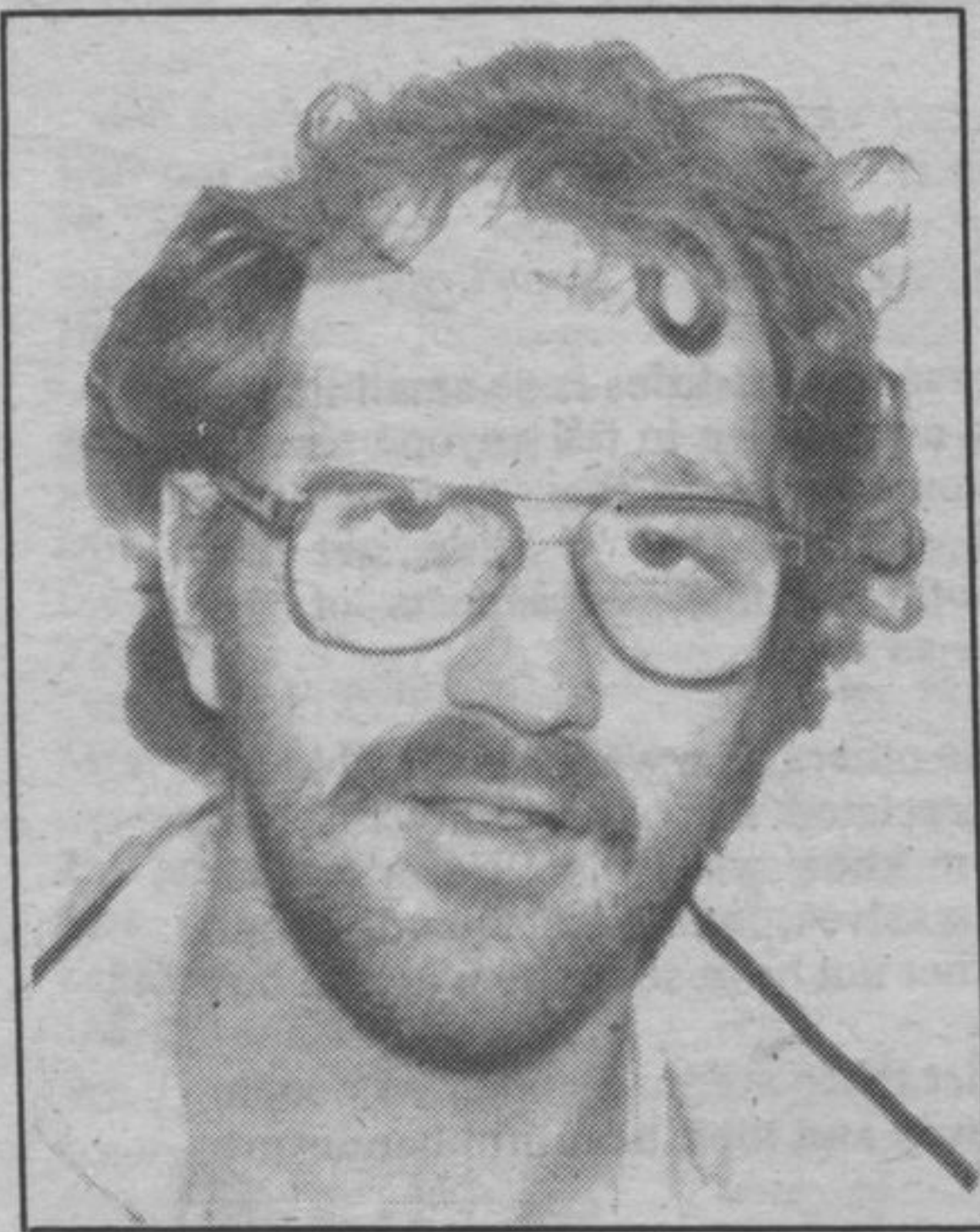


# Your Opinion . . .

*It was good but they should have more. It is also growing every year.*



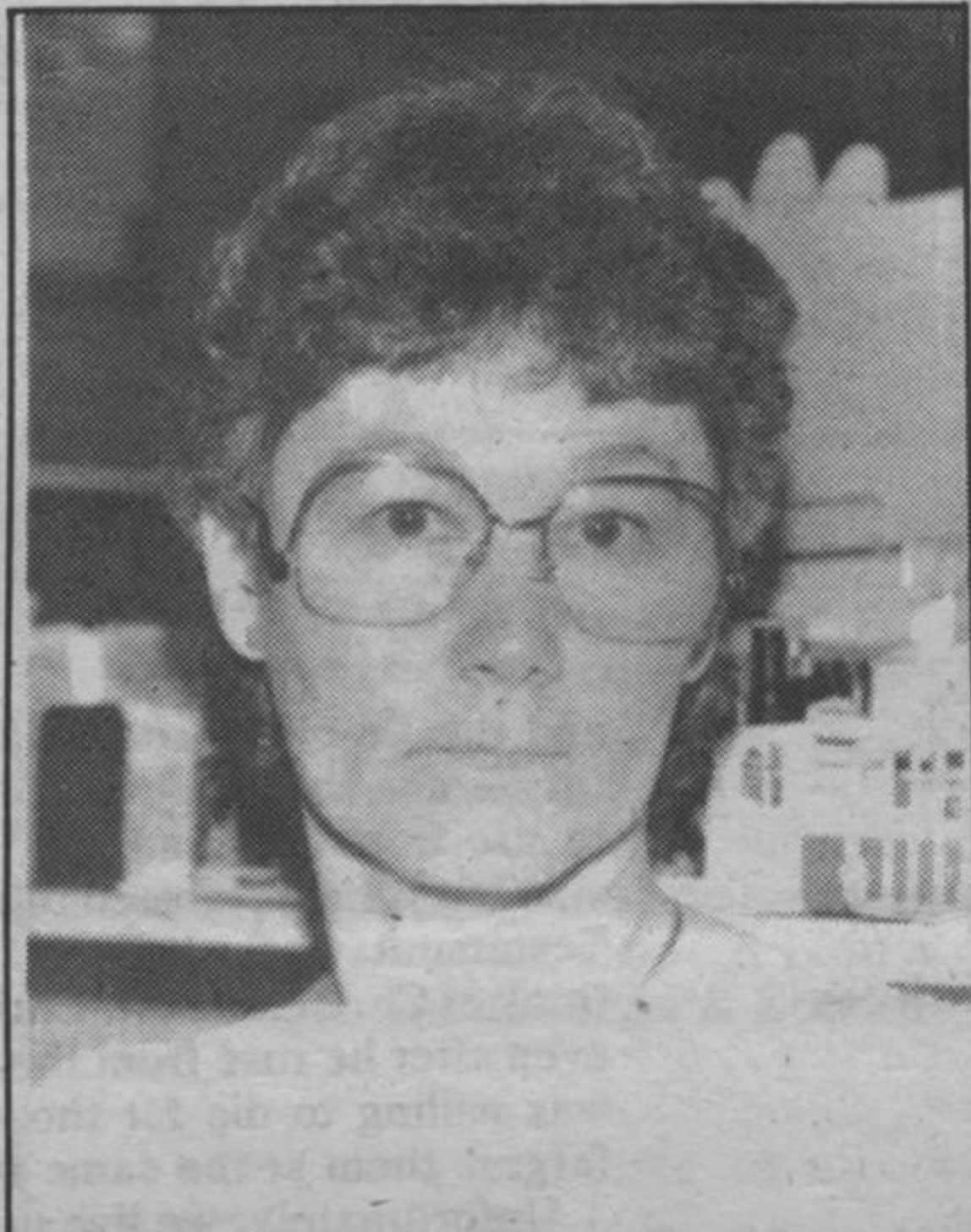
**Gisele Legacy:**

# Anti Nuke Caravan

Four months ago, the polls showed a nationwide desire for nuclear disarmament, this led to the formation of an organization called Nuclear Disarmament Coalition, formed by the Canadian Labour Congress, The Canadian Federation of Students, Voice of Women, Assembly of First Nations, Greenpeace Foundation, Operation Dismantle and small regional groups.

Petitions have been sent to various parts of Canada, including Schreiber, Terrace Bay and Thunder Bay and September is the month in which signatures will be gathered.

The Peace Petition Caravan Campaign objectives are to:

- 1) Stop the testing of the Cruise Missiles in Canada.
- 2) To have Canada officially declared a Nuclear-Weapons Free Zone
- 3) To redirect the wasteful spending on the arms race so as to fund human needs and ensure prosperity through peace.

We are soliciting the support of the local communities in the form of canvassing from door-to-door during September in order to present the petitions to the newly elected government in October.

The caravan will be in

the region around October 10, one leaves from St. John Newfoundland and the other from Victoria, to meet in Ottawa.
