NOTICE

CRTC - Public Notice 1984-248. The CRTC has received the following applications: Applications by Ontario AM licensees (former Class IV stations) operating on the frequencies 1230, 1240, 1340, 1400, 1450 and 1490 kHz, to amend their broadcasting licences by increasing the night-time power. Related Documents: public notice CRTC 1984-70 and Circular No. 295 dated 16 March 1984. In Canada Gazette Notice No. DGTC-001-84 dated 28 January 1984, the Department of Communications announced that international arrangements have been concluded between Canada and the United States to allow a large number of AM broadcasting stations to increase their night-time power. In the related documents mentioned above, the Commission invited AM licensees operating on any of the above-mentioned frequencies to apply for up to a four-fold increase in night-time power. The Commission has received a number of applications from Ontario licensees which are outlined in the attached appendix. Where may I examine the documents? You may examine all relevant documents during normal office hours at the local address given in this notice, at the CRTC, Central Building, Les Terrasses de la Chaudière, 1 Promenade du Portage, Room 561, Hull, Quebec, and at the following regional office: Complex Guy Favreau, East Tower, 200 Dorchester Blvd. West, Room 602 Montreal, Quebec H2Z 1X4.

How can I forward my comments to the CRTC? You may submit comments or interventions on each application, in letter or other form. You must indicate clearly, whether you support, oppose, or propose changes to an application, and whether you wish to appear at the public hearing. Both the applicant and the Commission must receive your intervention, and you must send the CRTC proof that you have so served the applicant, along with the original document addressed to the Secretary General. It must be signed with your name, address, and telephone number, and be received by the Commission on or before: Deadline for Intervention: 14 November 1984.

for drying dishes. This reduces the cost of operation from 3.3 cents per load to 1.7 cents per load, not including hot water costs. If your dishwasher does not have this feature, you can open the door as the dryer enters the drying cycles, and allow the dishes to air-dry. Small appliances can be energy-savers if used properly.

Items such as slow-cookers, microwave ovens, and electric fry-pans can be very efficient. Some small toaster-ovens, however can actually take more energy than the full-sized range for some foods. Before buying small appliances, consider storage space, safety features, and the multiple uses the appliance might have. For example, an electric fry-pan can be used to re-
