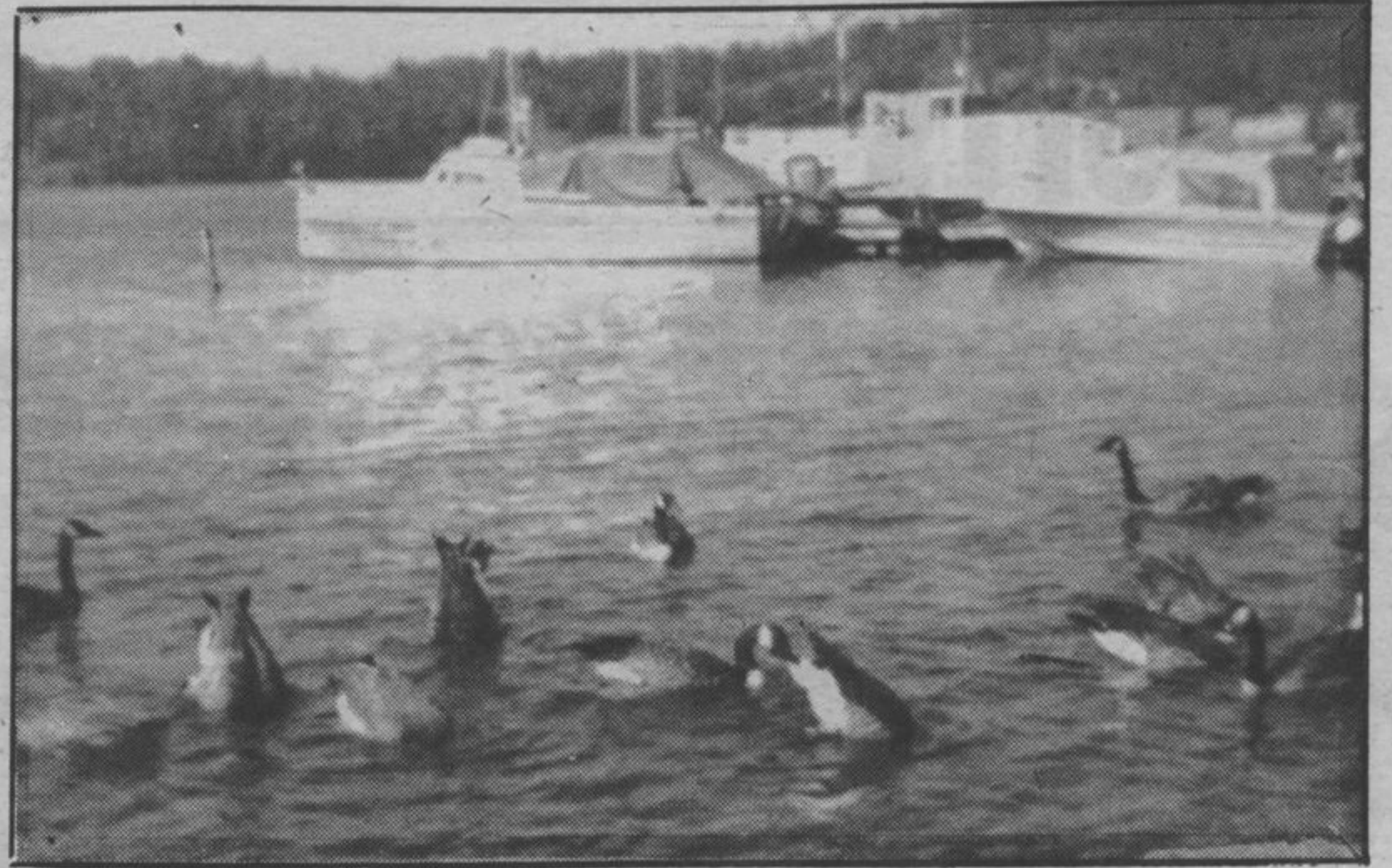
## Sailboat Must be Moved
