A total of three motor vehicle accidents were investigated resulting in property damage only.

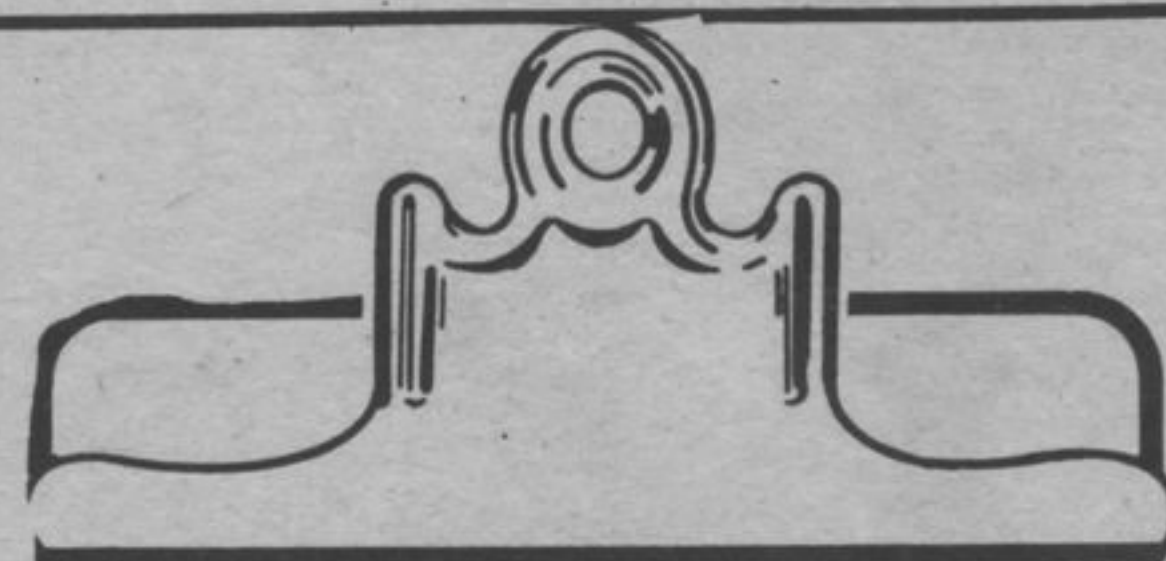

The Junior Girls came close, but lost their games in the final minutes of the contest. The years ahead look very promising for this team.

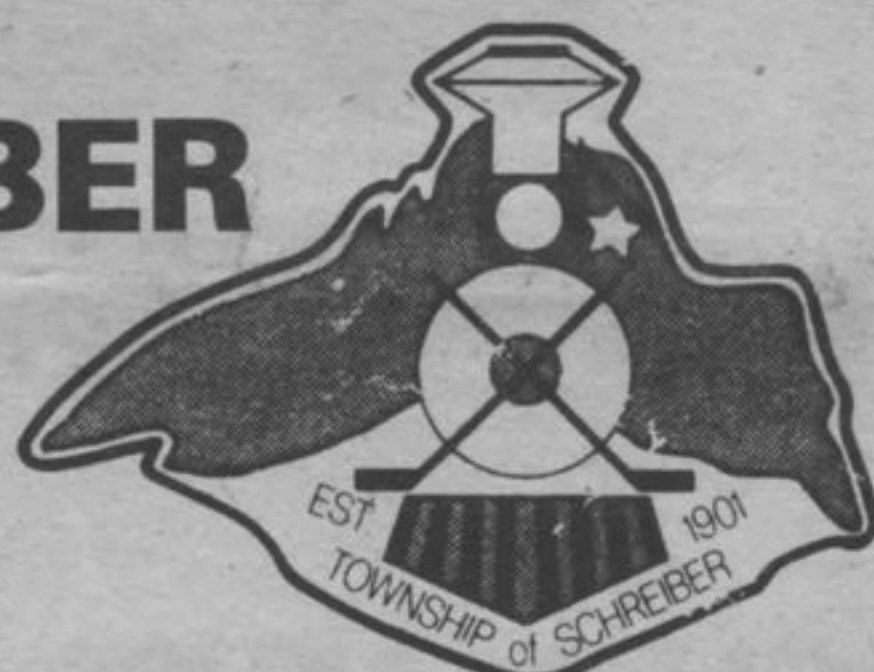

TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER PUBLIC NOTICE



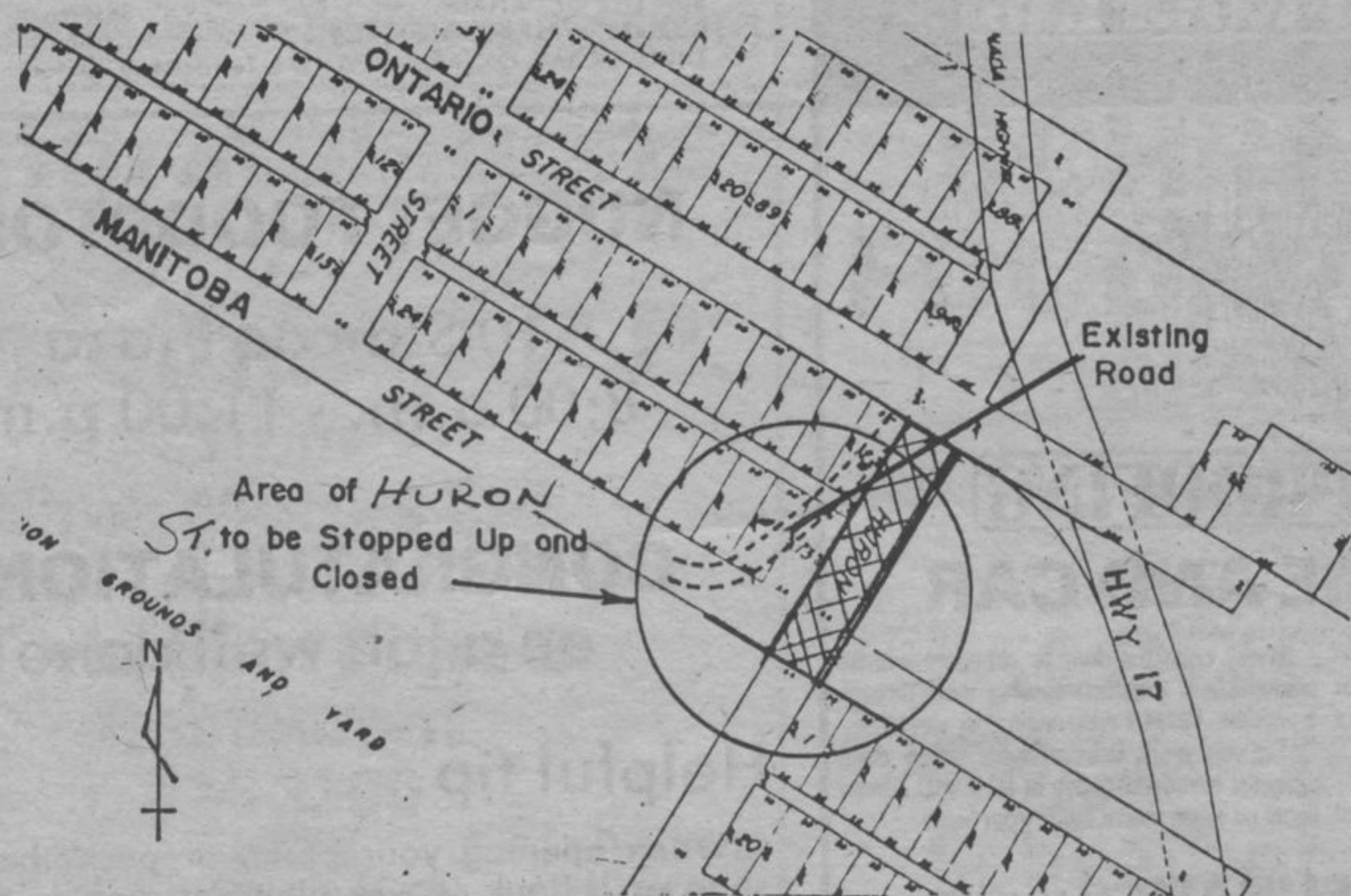
