Teachers Request Mediator cont'd.

tions."

"The Board's present offer represents a 3.6 per cent increase in the 3 lower levels and a 4.5 per cent increase to the teachers in the higher classifications. overall percentage increases fall far short of an impartial fact finder's recommendation and is totally unacceptable to the teachers."

"We have contacted the Education Relations Commission and have requested the assistance of a mediator who will assist the parties in order that a settlement satisfactory to the teachers, the board and the Catholic Community of this area, can be achieved."

The agreement being negotiated between the Board and the teachers is for one year. According to the report by Fact Finder, Mr. Paul Piche, the board has stated that even their initial position was offering money that they did not have and that the Ministry of Education had informed the boards that no further funding was available to them. The fact recommended finder that additional funding come from one or a combination of the following: 1) Apply salary saving from 1983-84 budget of \$30,000 towards this over-expenditure. 2) Use reserve or capital fund totalling \$193,000. 3) Higher tax requisition 4) Sale of Board owned real estate. 5) Increase their pupil-teacher ratio closer to the provincial average. The Fact Finder's report is not binding and negotiations will continue. The teachers have submitted another proposal to the Board and are willing to meet with them at anytime. In the meantime they await the response of the Education Relations Commission regarding the appointment of a media-




