A Look at Northern History

A Bicentennial Book, A Vast and Magnificent Land, was first seen by the public at an official ceremony, by invitation, in Thunder Bay and Sudbury on October 30, 1984.

The book traces the development and growth of the northland from a very interesting past to the present day happenings. It was co-published by the two Northern Universities, Lakehead University of Thunder Bay and Laurentian University of Sudbury. Many people contributed rare photographs, drawings and other unique historical documents which showed that the northland has a rich and colourful heritage. Each of the Ministry's have been loaned or donated a total of more than

3,000 photographs. (Some have not been used). The Book has 224 pages of interesting facts and photos of the north.

I, as a new comer to the area, was very interested to read and see the rich and wonderful history you natives of the north have from the first to the last chapter. Some of the rare photos that you will see are of, trappers and Indians in the area, young Sturgeon Falls trappers in the 1920s specialized in muskrat, racoon, fox, and skunk. By this time

beaver had almost disappeared from Northern Ontario. Beaver trapping was forbidden until 1932, when a government program to restock beaver was successful enough to allow trappers to take ten beaver each.

The New Liskeard athletic team, the Alerts, was organized in 1932. One team member, Mary Vanderfleet (Gaydon), competed in the 100-yard races and the relay at the 1932 Los Angeles Olympic Games. The Alerts competed in the British Em-

pire Games and the Canada Games in Halifax.

There are so many things to see it is hard to know where to start, to tell you about this great book. Complimentary copies of the book will be given to all high schools, public libraries and museums in the region.
