

Minor hockey week full of fun

Canada Works grants announced

Cochrane-Superior M.P. Keith Penner has announced on behalf of the Hon. Flora MacDonald, Minister of Employment and Immigration, that \$413,969 has been allocated to our riding under this year's Canada Works Program.

The funds will be used for twenty-five projects and will create ninety-eight winter jobs for people without work in our area. Four projects have been approved for the private sector for a total of \$89,187. These projects will create 24 jobs for 257 work weeks. Twenty-one projects have been approved for non-profit groups for a total of \$324,782. These are expected to create 74 jobs for 1005 work weeks.

"These activities will greatly benefit the communities involved by providing services and performing tasks which might not otherwise be undertaken. Mostly, it creates jobs which are badly needed," said Mr. Penner.

The popularity and worth of this program can be measured by the fact that fifty-four applications were received totalling nearly 2.4 million dollars for consideration by the **Employment Development** Branch. The allocation for Canada Works this year is considerably less than last
