


Delena Lavigne: I feel it would be a great idea. It's something kids around this area really need. It

Canada - Taiwan exchange

The Canar Taiwan Friendship Association (CFTA) in co-operation with the Canadian Society of Taiwan is planning a student exchange program for this summer. We are looking for up to ten senior high school students from across Northwestern Ontario to go to Taiwan for a similar period. The Canadian students will be placed with a Chinese family under the

auspices of the Canadian Society of Taiwan.

Taiwan, a Chinese island province 150 km off the cost of mainland China, has been the seat of the Nationalist Chinese goverfnment (Republic of China) since 1949. Taiwan today is a modern industrialized nation (the sixth largest trading partner of the US) with a living standard second only to Japan in the Far East. Taiwan represents a unique blend of old and modern China. The island's art collections (removed from mainland China during the war) and its scholarly research into Chinese history and culture are unparallelled anywhere in the world. Many of China's ancient religious rites and customs can still be seen today in Taiwan's ubiquitous temples.

Costs of the program still remain to be worked out, but are expected to be in the neighbourhood of \$1500 per student. A series of information meetings across the Northwest is being planned for March. Voyageur tales


