Cream together 1/2 cup margarine and 1 cup sugar. Beat in 1 egg until light. Add 2 tbls. lemon juice and 1 tsp. grated lemon peel and 11/4 tsps. caraway

Stir together 21/3 cups flour and 1/2 tsp. baking soda and add to above mixture. Shape into a roll 2" thick and wrap and chill 1 hour or overnight. Cut into 14" slices and place on a greased cookie Bake for 10 minutes at 375.
