Centennial Committee, will present a Budget for Council's consideration, detailing the final cost of the various programs.

Letter from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, advising that a severance application from Marathon Realty (CP Rail), to cover the severing of a tract of land from the CPR plot of land at Ontario Street and Highway 17 (N. Nesbitt), had been approved, subject to the condition that public access be deeded to the Township of Schreiber, and that the Township assume responsibility for the maintenance of the access to the land to be severed.

Council authorized the sale of part 2, of Reference Plan 55R-5026 to R. Martin, for the sum of \$1,000.00 be given first, second and third reading, and also authorized the sale

of Part 4 of Reference Plan 55R-5445, to G. Smith, for the sum of \$300.00 be given first, second and third reading, and finally passed.

Clerk was instructed to write to J. Noon, requesting permission to dump excess material in the pit north of Langworthy St., and also to write to CP Rail, pointing out that once again excessive blockage of the crossing at Main St. is being allowed to occur, and requesting their co-operation in keeping train blockage of the crossing to a minimum.

Council reviewed preliminary drawings of the new Schreiber Fire Hall, and indicated that it was in order to proceed with the completion of the drawings, and the establishment of tender specifications, as a preliminary to calling for tenders for the construction of the hall.

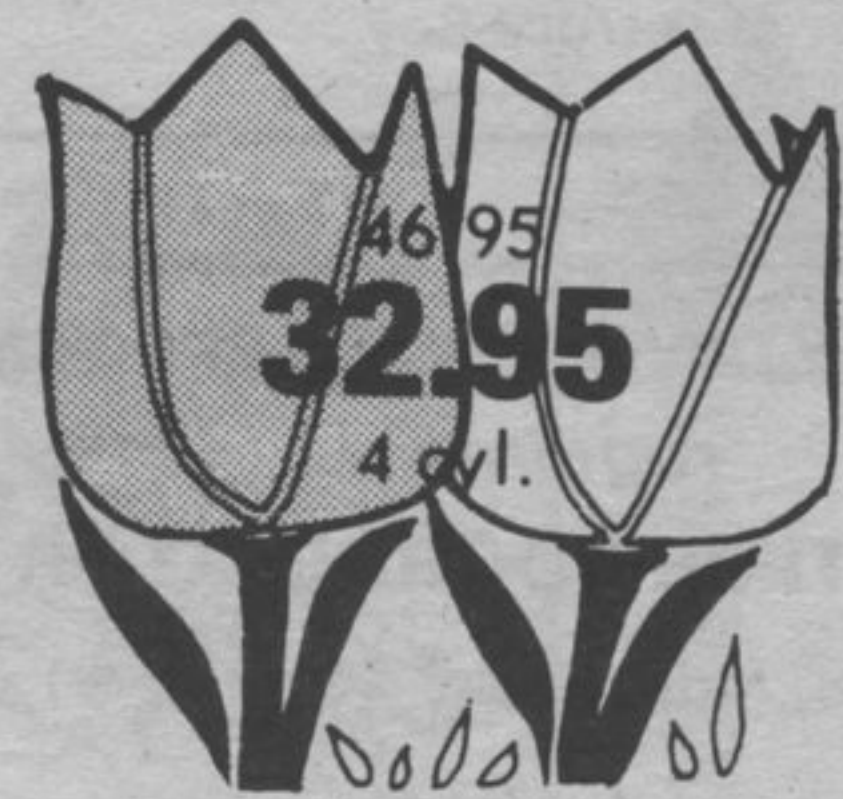

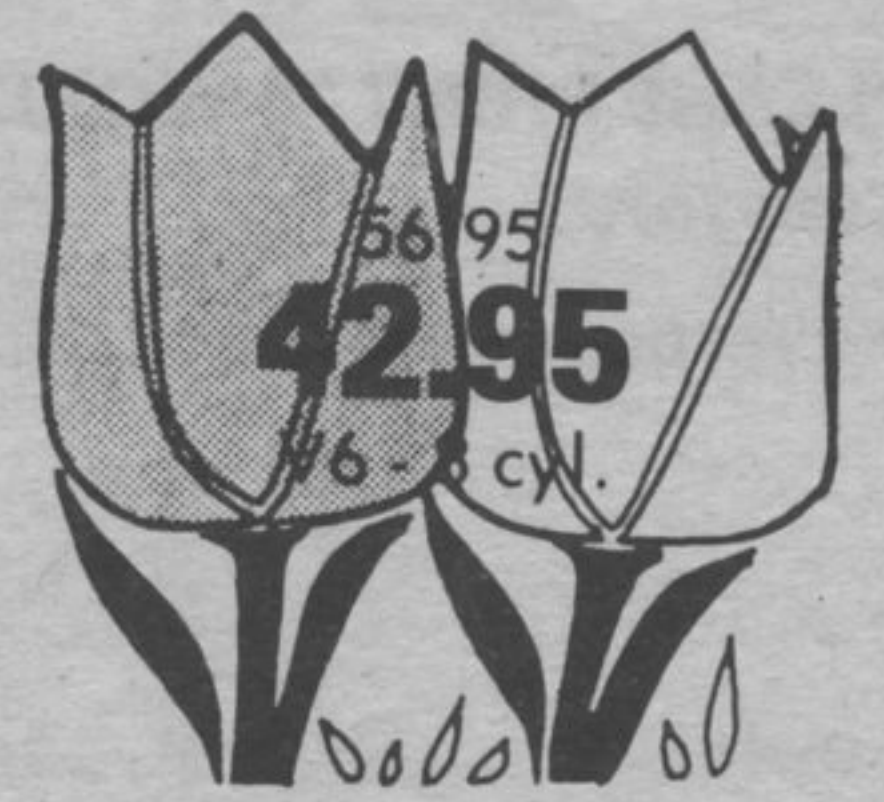
