are often manipulated by Satan). Jesus' power rested on the love of his Father - a love which would endure every humiliation, terror and suffering to draw humankind to him. Jesus taught that God's love was limitless, and not bounded by man's order of morality and ethics. Such a man claiming to be the Messiah would have forced Judas' hand.

Luke 22:3-4 reads that "Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve; he went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers how he might betray him to them." Was this Judas' attempt to force Jesus' hand, to make our Saviour "prove his Messiahship" through the power of the world. This would certainly be in the interests of Satan, the Great Deceiver, to turn worthy motives into diabolical schemes of his own design.

Whatever Judas' motive, it precipitated all of the events that led to Jesus' arrest, trial, scourging,

crucifixion, and death. This, in itself, kindled God's wrath. It almost made inevitable Judas' self-destruction. For us, Judas presents some sobering thoughts as we experience our Holy Week. We all have the potential to be Judas Iscariots because of our sinful natures. Without the grace of God and inspiration of his Holy Spirit,

we can and do try to control Jesus in our lives, when we fit our beliefs to scripture, rather than allow scripture to inform our beliefs.

Various Christian legalists in the U.S. recently claimed that women who had abortions, should be executed for murder. This Gerry Falwell teaching ignores the issues surrounding abortions and makes claims on God and His word, which are uninspired. Many other issues

arise where we can be Judas Iscariots and force God's hand for 30 pieces of silver or any other worldly motive. Unfortunately, we'll never know what motivated Judas Iscariot to commit his crime of betrayal. What we do know is that Jesus Christ can never be narrowed down to fit our own religious, social and political purposes. Perhaps the most important thing is that Judas' motivation will remain a mystery.



Public meeting concerning a proposed zoning by-law amendment

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Terrace Bay will hold a public meeting on May 9th, 1985 at 7:00 p.m. in the municipal office, 12 Simcoe Plaza, to consider a proposed zoning by-law amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act.

The proposed zoning amendment would change the zone category of a lot on the north side of Radisson Avenue having a frontage of approximately 30 metres, (as shown below) from I (Institutional) to C1 (Special Commercial) which would permit a car wash as well as all general commercial uses on this property. The property will also be designated as a site-plan control area.



Any person may attend the public meeting and/or make a written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed zoning by-law amendment.
