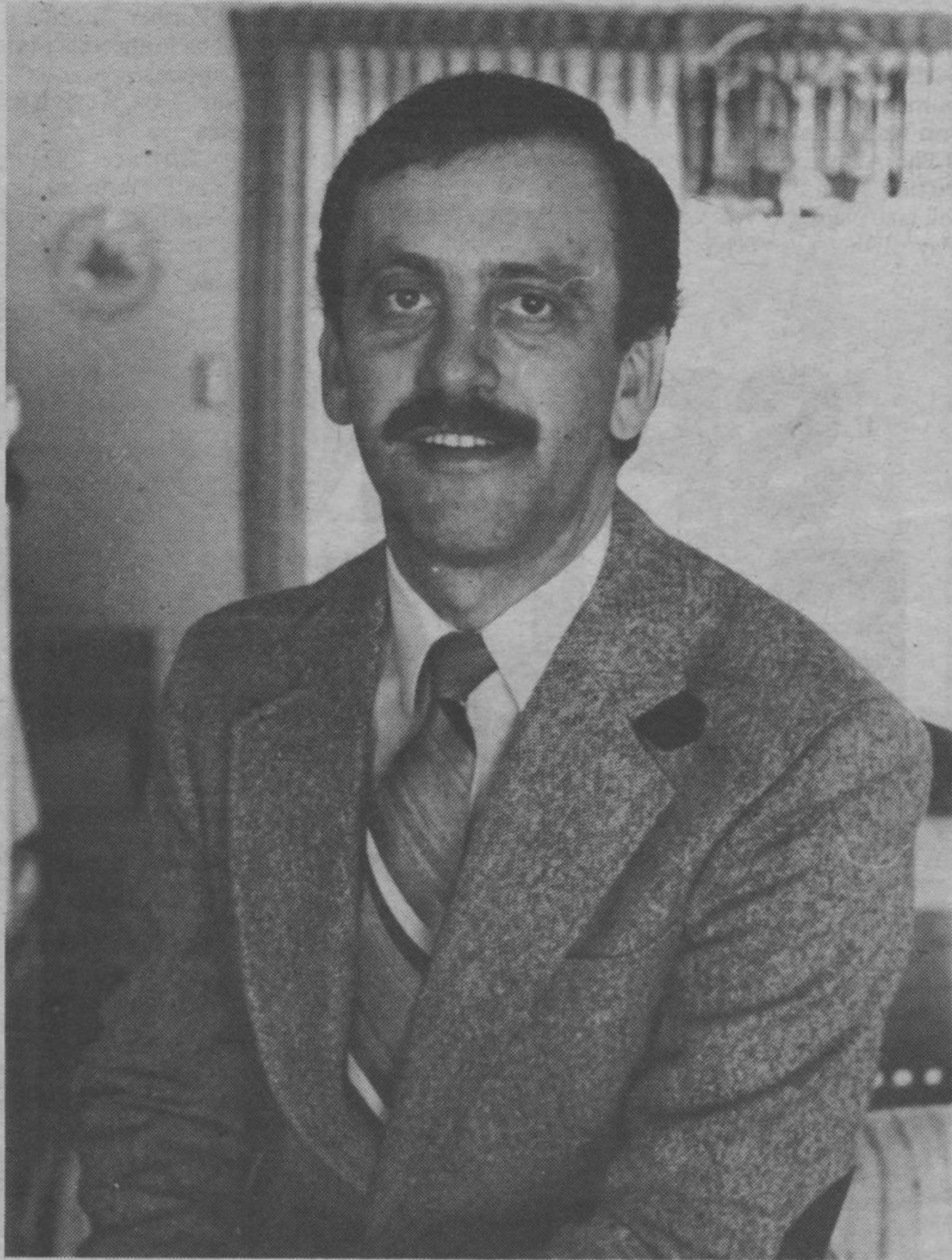


Files visits News office

Mr. Jim Files, Progressive Conservative Candidate for the Lake Nipigon Riding visited the NEWS office last week to discuss important issues and concerns of the people in this riding. Mr. Files talked about the complex problem of reforestation in this area. He believes there should be at least three more greenhouses in Lake Nipigon Riding, and they should be privately owned. He also believes the mills must become more responsible for reforestation. Mr. Files gives this issue top priority and believes the Progressive Conservatives have a strong, strategic plan in this regard.

We asked Mr. Files about the Budworm problem and how he is proposing to deal with it. Mr. Files replied that Pulp and Paper is very, very important to Northern Ontario people, and spraying must begin soon, "We must take precautions, especially in populated areas," he said, "this problem must not be allowed to continue, we must use common sense to discover a happy medium within an ecology and economic base."

We asked Mr. Files about the proposed changes on the CNR, the Nakina run-through and the removal of cabooses. Mr.

launch in 500 miles of lake front property. There are many things to be done, the first, opening up cottage lots to those who have a desire to purchase. Many people even outside of our area would like to spend the summer here and that would be good for our economy. Of course hand in hand with tourism is our transportation system. Some of these access routes classify as roads but certainly not highways."

What about Chemical Transportation on our highways and railways? "I have been to Armprior Federal Disaster Planning Center and from that visit developed a disaster plan at the hospital. These chemicals must be transported; let's make sure it is done the absolute

safest way. They must be identified properly, there must be tighter controls."

Mr. Files went on to say that this riding really needs a representative in Toroto,

who will be sure to get the people their fair share from the resources that are taken out of the North.

Files explained that he has been working against the Nakina run through proposal since last winter and brought the Honorable Rene Piche to Nakina to talk with the people there. Mr. Files said "I am working closely to deter this proposal and I can honestly say there is very good co-operation between the federal and provincial governments on this issue." As far as the removal of cabooses, "It may work fine in Southern Ontario, I don't know, but Northern Ontario is a very different climate. There are no reports to prove it is safer."

NOTICE TREE PLANTERS

The Ministry of Natural Resources is presently accepting applications from persons interested in planting trees from approximately May 15 to June 21, 1985.

Accommodations for the duration of the plant will be either at Ramsey Lake Silvicultural Camp (north of Manitouwadge) or Portage Lake Silvicultural Camp (near Great West Timber Camp 7).

Planters will be paid on a piece rate basis at 8¢/tree for bareroot stock and 7¢/tree for container stock. Assessments will be carried out to determine the number of properly planted trees for payment.
