classical nature as well as jazz, ragtime and calypso. The concert series will provide pleasant evenings of fine music for the whole family.

Devonian Duo launches concert series

When Alberta's Susan Hoepfner and Robert Kortgaard made their New York debut at Town Hall, the New York Times critic praised their "cool confidence", "refreshing extroversion" and "joyous abandon." Audiences praise their fresh and exciting approach to programming which spans the music from Bach to the Suite for Flute and Jazz Piano by the popular French composer, Claude Bolling. Susan Hoepfner began her musical training in Alberta where she has appeared as soloist with the Calgary Youth Orchestra and as a featured artist on Calgary's "Musical Portraits." She has also performed in recital with the celebrated flautist, James Galway and was recently

asked to substitute for him at a rehearsal of a flute concerto by Corigliano. Since winning the Grand Prize of the 1983 Canadian Music Competition, Miss Hoepfner has performed recitals in North America, Argentina and Portugal, as well as concerto appearances in Toronto, Calgary, The Maritimes, Lisbon and Buenos Aires. She has also performed as guest soloist with the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra. Pianist, Robert Kortgaard holds a Master's degree from the Julliard School of Music, where he was a student of Anita Doromann and the late Mr. Irwin Freundlich. Since winning the Grand Prize at the Canadian Music Competition, Mr. Kortgaard has performed throughout Canada in

recital and as a soloist with several major Canadian orchestras including the Toronto Symphony and the Hamilton Philharmonic. He was featured in the C.B.C. Television program "Tribute to Healey Willan". He has also performed with the New Music Series at Columbia University, New York. In 1984, Mr. Kortgaard was awarded a Canada Council grant to further his studies in Darington, England.

The Devonian Duo is presently touring under the auspices of Youth and Music Canada/Jeunesses musicales du Canada and will be presented in concert here in Terrace Bay in the High School Gymnasium Wednesday evening November 6 at 8 p.m.
