"Double Parking in School Areas Dangerous"

It would be appreciated if parents picking their children up at school would refrain from double parking, even if this is only for a few moments, as this can be very hazardous considering the children and cyclists leaving the school at the same time.

Re: St. Martin's School, please note:

In order to alleviate the traffic congestion in front of St. Martin's school, and in the interest of the school children, we are proposing the following: the area in front of the school be used strictly as a drop off or pick up area. We would ask you not to park any longer than necessary in front of the school. We would also ask that you not stop or park on Selkirk Ave. opposite the school. This area is already posted "No Parking."

Terrace Bay Police responded to a call where a Break and Enter had been attempted. There was minor damage but no entry was gained into the building.

Several thefts were investigated in the past few weeks including theft from Birchwood Terrace, from a local Motel, three thefts over \$200 from Kimberly Clark and theft of gas, this latter resulting in a male person being charged under the Criminal Code to appear in Provincial Court, November 13, 1985.

For incidents of Wilful Damage were attended by Police. Two of these were damage done to vehicles, one parked outside of the High School and one parked at a local Motel. Also reported were wilful damage at a local Motel and the Public School.

Several Summonses and Warrants were processed including a Search Warrant on a Schreiber resident suspected of having stolen property in his possession. This matter still under investigation.

One coplaint was received regarding parking in the School Bus Loading Zone.

Four Motor Vehicle Accidents have been investigated, three involved over \$700 damage each and one was a single motor vehicle hitting a moose. Terrace Bay also assisted Schreiber OPP at the scene of an accident at the Steel River Hill.


