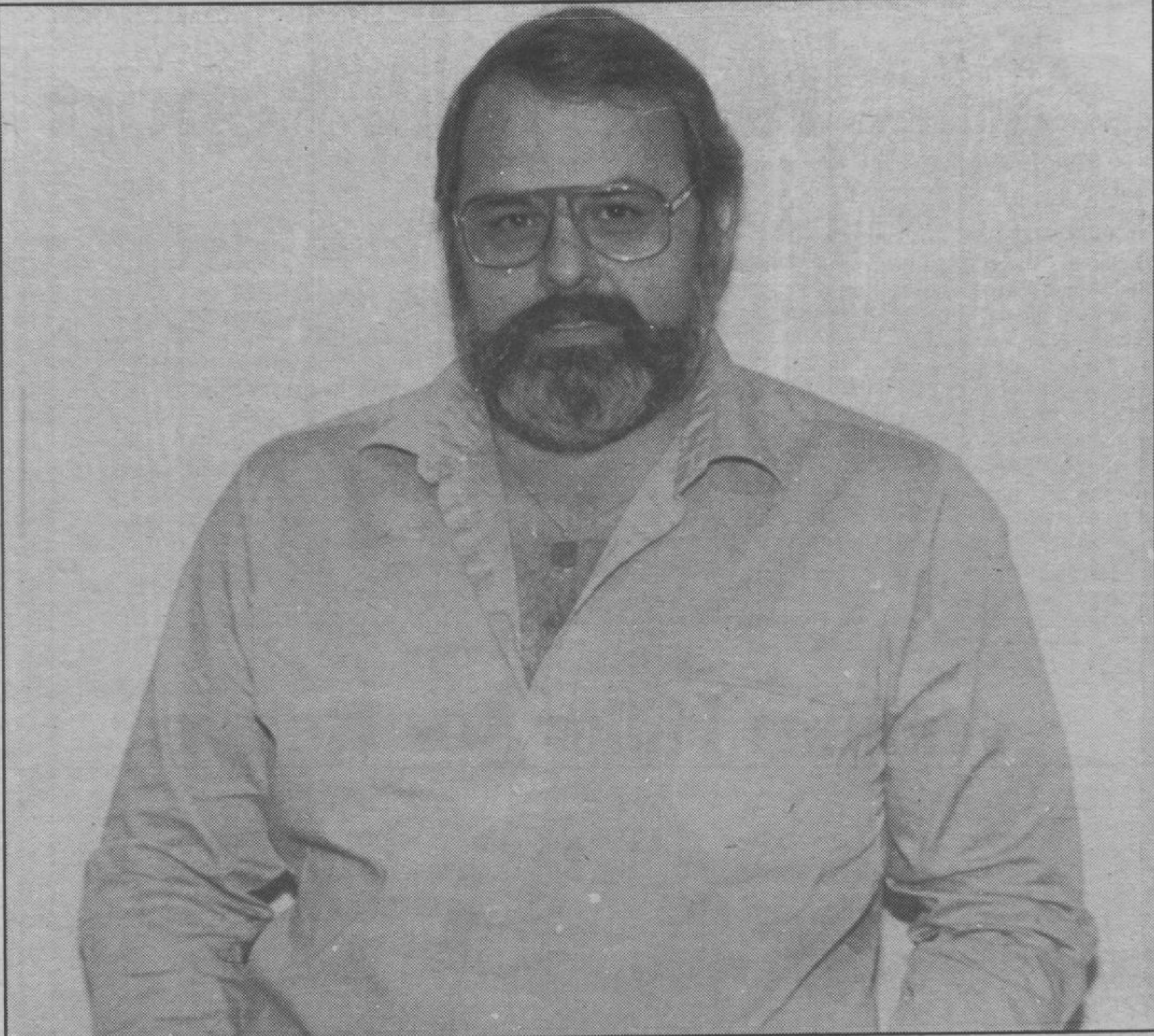


Cook of the Week

Peanut Butter Cookies

Kids love these - and so do I.
 1/2 cup butter
 1/2 cup brown sugar
 1/2 cup white sugar
 1/2 cup peanut butter

1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 egg
 1 1/2 cups flour
 1/2 teaspoon soda
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 1/2 pkg. chocolate chips

Mix in the order given. Drop teaspoonfuls of dough on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for about 10 minutes.

A Class A mechanic comes from Geraldton once a week, but what happens in the meantime, who is working on the buses our kids ride every day?
