
# Cook of the Week

### Sweet & Sour Chicken Balls

3 chicken breasts, boiled for 45 minutes. Let cool and cut into 1" squares.

3 cups of flour 11/2 tsp. salt 2-3 eggs

3 tbsp. oil 11/2 tsp. sugar 11/2 tsp. baking powder I tsp. baking soda

Combine all ingredients and add enough water to make a thin batter, but not watery. Let stand 1 hour. Heat oil in deep fryer to highest setting. If chicken balls cook too fast, turn down heat. Pour all chicken cubes into batter and drop into hot oil one at a time. Drain on paper

#### Sauce:

water

½ cup sugar

½ cup vinegar I tbsp. soya sauce ½ cup pineapple chunks

1/3 cup pineapple juice 1/4 cup of catsup

towel.

sprinkle of pepper

2 tbsp. of cornstarch Boil mixture; thicken with 2 tbsp. cornstarch. Pour over chicken balls.

### O.P.P. Report

#### Vehicles must stop for school bus with red signal lights flashing

The Lake Superior Board of Education has commenced an In-Town school bus service in Schreiber. This bus goes about the community stopping at designated pick-up locations. Early experience with this new service reflects the fact that a number of motor vehicle drivers have been ignoring the flashing lights and overtaking or driving by the bus when meeting. This is a violation of the Highway Traffic Act and carries a penalty of a minimum of \$100.00 to a

maximum of \$500.00 for a first offence. For a second offence, the penalty is increased to \$250.00 to \$1000.00 or to six months imprisonment or to both the fine and imprisonment. In addition, 6 demerit points are assessed against the driver. Drivers are reminded that the school bus stopping law is valid on streets in a city, town or village, as well as, any other Highway.

On October 29th, 1985, Police investigated a theft of stereo speakers from a local car and later, a report of the theft of a half ton truck which was parked at a Schreiber residence. A male subject has been arrested and subsequently charged with theft under \$200.00 and theft of motor vehicle. The accused appeared in Thunder Bay Criminal Court and was remanded in custody to a future date.

Schreiber Detachment personnel are continuing their investigation of the circumstances of a motor vehicle being vandalized at Walkers Lake in Schreiber as a result of a criminal occurrence. The complaint

subsequently withdrawn and this aspect of the occurrence is being further investigated.

On October 22nd, 1985, a male subject was arrested on Winnipeg Street, Schreiber and charged with "Causing a Disturbance". He was subsequently charged with "Resisting Arrest", "Assault Peace Officer", and "Possession of a Drug for the Purpose of Trafficking". He will appear in Schreiber Provincial Court on November 13th, 1985.

As a result of investigations commenced on August 25th, 1985, a male resident of Pays Plat has been charged with two counts of Break, Enter & Theft and one count of Theft over \$200. A quantity of stolen property was recovered and the charged person will appear in Schreiber Criminal Court on November 13th, 1985.

In addition to the foregoing, reports of one Break and Enter and one Theft Over \$200.00 were investigated during the past week along with two offences under the Liquor Licence Act. A safe week of using the Highways was experienced with no accidents occurring in the Schreiber O.P.P. Detachment area.
