

Plus II released

Alcohol and Drug Concerns, Inc. in co-operation with Bell Canada has published a new drug education programme, PLUS II, for Grade 7 and 8 classrooms in Ontario.

A news release dated Jan. 6 from the non-profit organization based in Scarborough explained that PLUS II is expected to reinforce the trend among Ontario Junior High and High School students to decrease drug and alcohol use.

Although students of today are more and more knowledgeable about the risks of drug use, Dr. Reginald Smart of the Addiction Research Foundation said that "drugs remain a serious problem for some young people."

A Gallup Poll conducted

by the federal government last year indicated that many young people are prepared to ignore the dangers of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco because "drinking and smoking help reduce nervousness and shyness in social settings."

PLUS II will assist Grade 7 and 8 students and teachers in exploring and responding in a healthy way to the social pressures and choices facing adolescents today, the release added. PLUS stands for Positive Life Using Skills.

The PLUS programme is being offered to teachers and principals in all elementary schools in Ontario. Bell Canada has funded the production costs.
