In the January 22 issue of the News, a statement originally attributed to Angie Gereghty was not actually made by that person. The statement appeared in a story on the Day Care Committee.


The Christmas insert which came with the December 18, 1985 issue of the News included an article titled "Christmas at our house" which had a line that may have left an incorrect impression with some readers.
