Notice Snow Removal Assistance Program

On Monday, February 24th, 1986, your municipal Council established a program to assist seniors and handicapped persons with snow removal from their driveways and driveway entrances.

To be eligible for the program, an applicant family must have at least one person who is either physically handicapped or who is aged 65 or over, and must be the only residents of the dwelling unit to be served. An application form, which contains a statement that the applicant is financially unable to make other arrangements, must be completed. Forms are available at the municipal office.

This program is being undertaken with the financial assistance of the Ministry of Community and Social Services, which will pay 50% of the costs. The remaining 50% will be paid out of the municipality's general funds, with the provision that participants may make a partial contribution at their discretion.

This program is being undertaken for balance of the winter on an experimental basis. If it appears that costs are too high or the program is being abused it will not be restarted for next winter.

The actual snow removal is to be carried out by private contractors under agreement with the municipality. Individuals or companies interested in quoting for the supply of this service are invited to contact the undersigned.

If you handle industrial wastes, this notice is **INDISPENSABLE**.

On June 17, 1985, Waste Management Regulation 309 was proclaimed in Ontario. Essentially, it will hold anyone who generates, treats, stores, hauls or disposes of industrial waste responsible for its safe handling.

The Regulation also institutes new Manifest requirements; provides definitions of hazardous and liquid industrial wastes; and sets new standards for carriers. MORE importantly, it increases the responsibilities of generators and requires their registration by September 17, 1986.

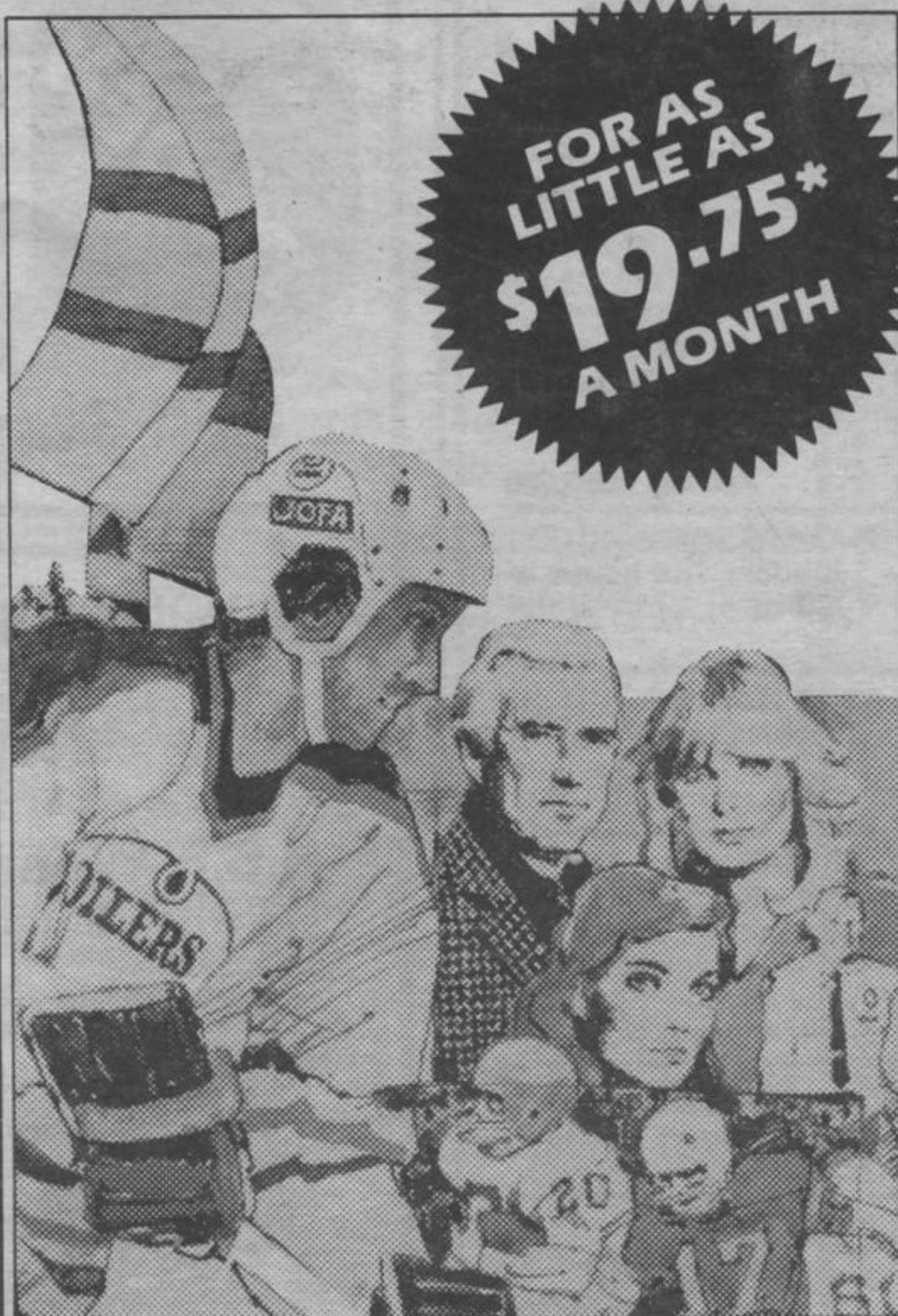

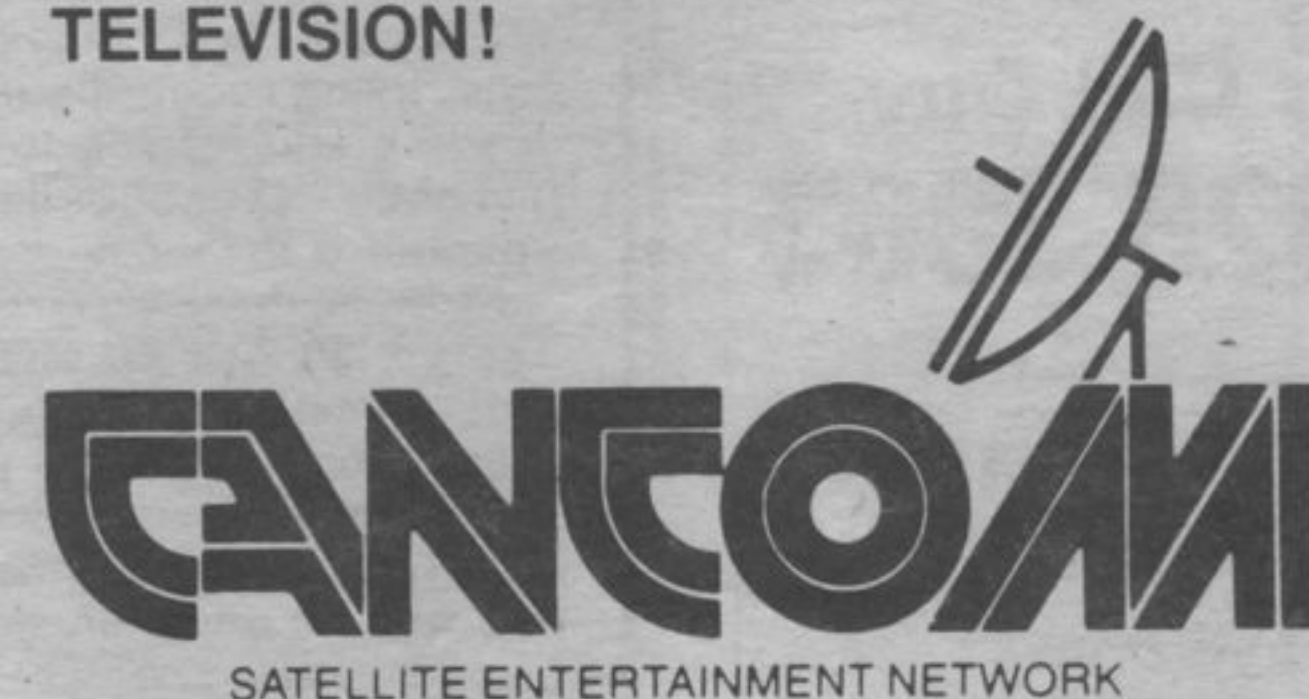
