Any parent with a child who is eligible for enrolment in JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN or KINDERGARTEN is asked to call the school at 824-2553 to pre-register, or complete the form below and send it to the school. (Children currently attending Holy Angels School

Parents are requested to bring to the school, birth and baptismal certificates as well as immunization cards.

KINDERGARTEN — To be eligible to attend Kindergarten in September 1986, children must be 5 years old on or before December 31, 1986. (Born in 1981)

JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN — To be eligible to attend Junior Kindergarten in September, 1986, children must be 4 years old on or before December 31, 1986.

Formal registration will take place in April.

PLEASE NOTE:

It is now law, in the Province of Ontario, that immunization for diptheria, whooping cough, tetanus, poliomyelitis, and for measles, mumps, and rubella (German measles) be completed before pupils enter school in September.

Please consult your family doctor or the Thunder Bay District Health Unit if immunization has not been completed.

Parents can avoid many birth related defects through sensible living habits. You should take these precautions:

- Stick to a well balanced diet with lots of fresh fruits and vegetables.
- Avoid excessive use of alcohol and non medical, drugs.
- 3. Cut down or cut out smoking.
- Ask your doctor to make sure you both have compatible blood types.
- 5. Notify your doctor of any family history of retardation or other medical problems on both sides.
- 6. Be sure you are immunized against German measles.
- 7. Avoid excessive exposure to X-Rays.
- 8. Get your doctor's approval before taking drugs or medication and take only what is necessary.
- Visit your doctor regularly . . and take his advice.
- 10. Insist that your baby be given a P.K.U. test before leaving the hospital. It could mean preventing retardation before it occurs.
