It seems quite a few Moslems are becoming Christians. Their Bible studies, however, are poor due to the shortage of bibles. It seems they are

only printed in Singapore, which makes it difficult and costly.

His Grace said they are getting refugees from Ethiopia, and they are always looking for a home. All these people have simple feelings for God. It was a most inspiring talk which I am sure all those present enjoyed.

After His Grace was finished speaking, a rubber of bridge was played. All in all it was a lovely way to spend a day.

Now at this time I would like to write an answer to phone calls I have received in regard to the problem of only one entrance and exit to the new townsite. Believe me, it is a problem. I know our town council has really been working to try and find a solution to this, so my "bite" is really for the Ministry of Transportation.

This problem was brought home to us very clearly in the house fire at 9 Terrace Heights last week, which could not have come at a worse time. Folks who go home for lunch could not get back on the highway, so cars were

lined up for both incoming and outgoing traffic.

So, until next week, take time out of your busy day for a kind word and a cheery smile. You will feel all the better for it. So long.

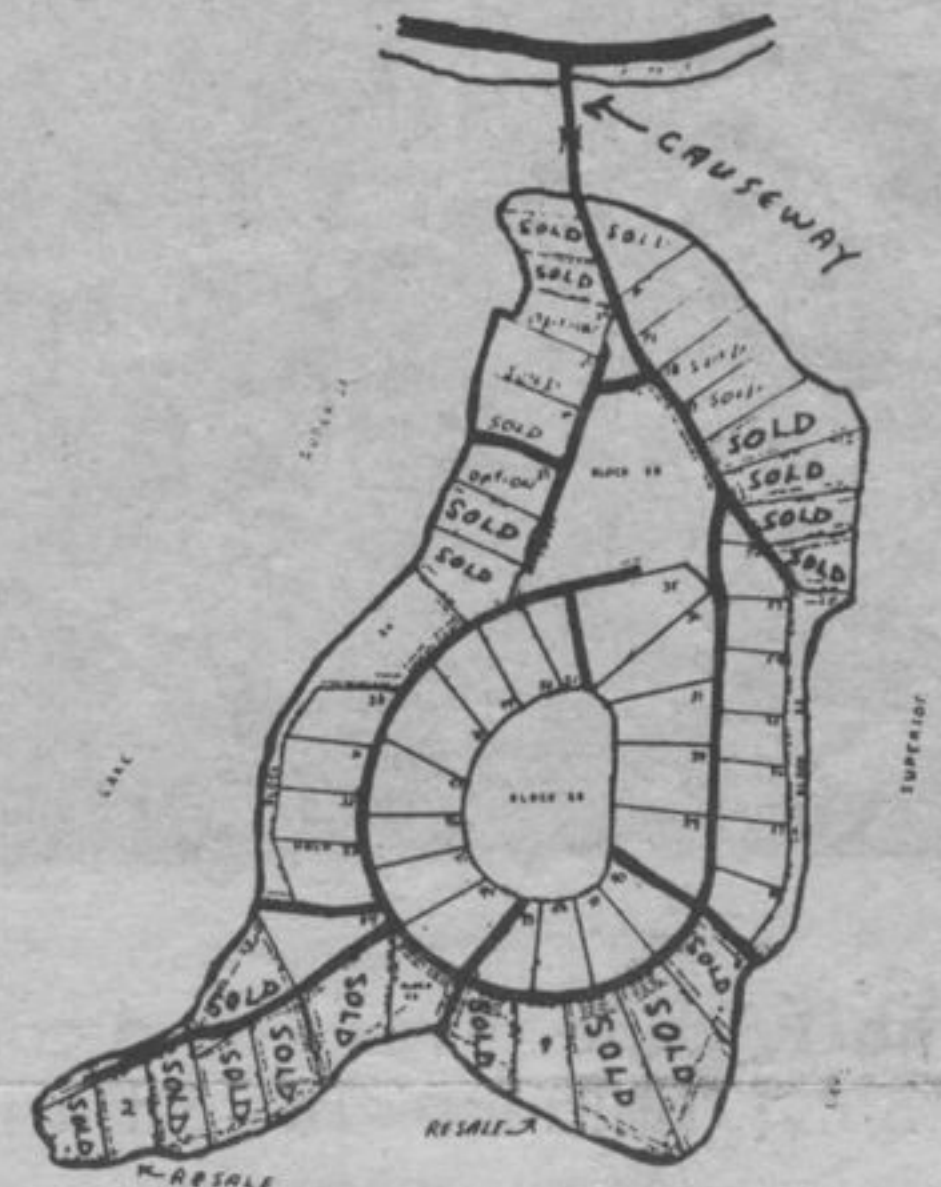

RABIES

IT'S NO WAY FOR A FRIEND TO DIE.

Protect your family. Vaccinate and leash your pet. Avoid strays.

Last year in Ontario 2,150 people were treated for rabies exposure. As a result, the Ontario Ministry of Health is urging all residents to be extremely cautious. Since the disease is fatal to humans as well as pets, anyone who's been in contact with a rabid animal must take a series of shots.

You can protect your family by taking these simple precautions. First, vaccinate your pets against rabies. Second, keep them on a leash. Third, everyone, especially children, should be taught

to avoid strays and wildlife that might carry rabies. Always wear gloves when handling a dead animal. Remember, farm animals can be infected too.

Protect your family and friends by protecting your pets from rabies. It's no way for a friend to die.
