cards sent to sick and bereaved, many thank you notes were received.

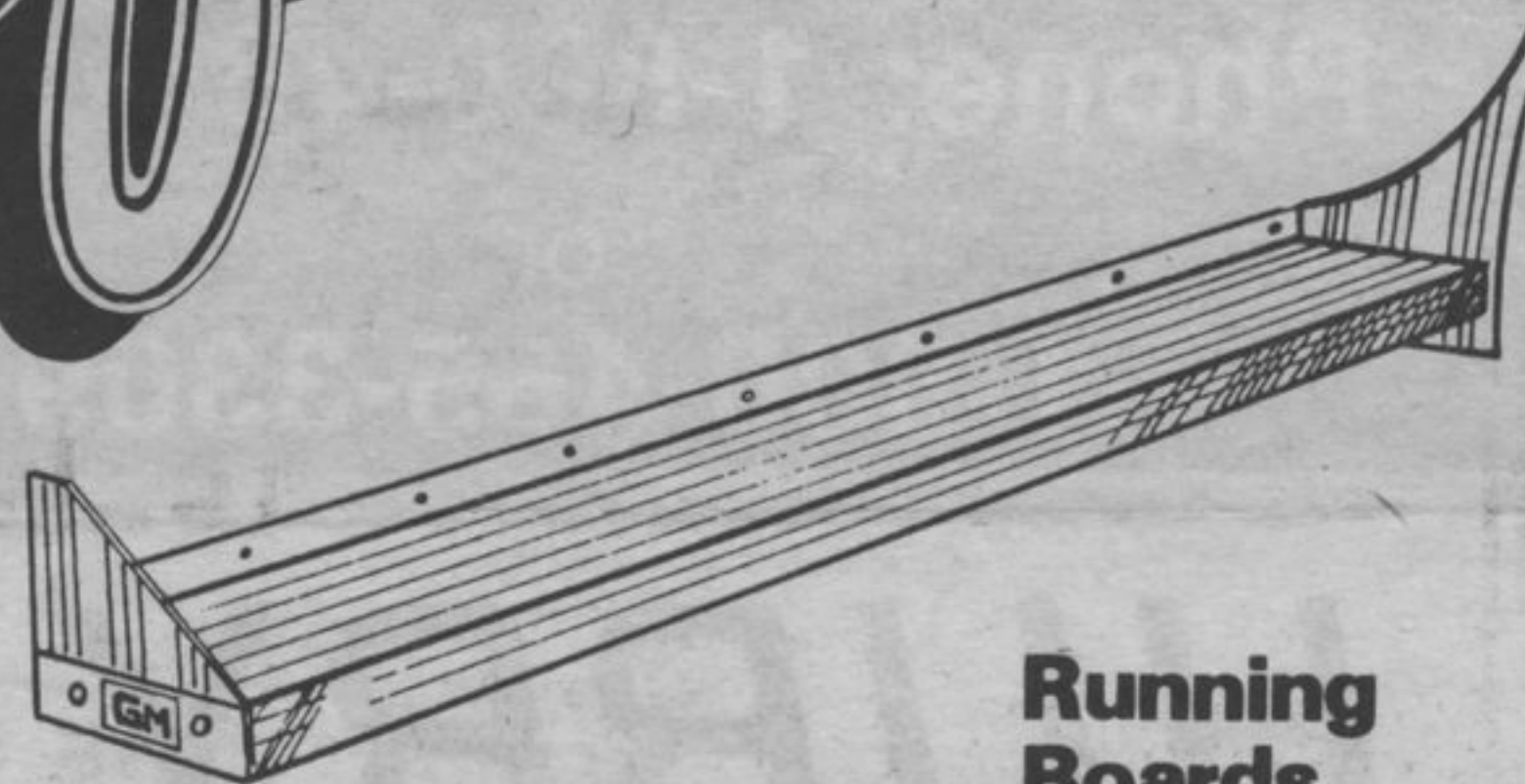
