

Marathon (3053 population) in 1985 had 751 participants and a 27.8 percent turnout. In 1986 they had 1017 participants and a 29.4 percent turnout.

Manitouwadge (3455 population) in 1985 had 630 participants and a 17 percent turnout. In 1986 they had 963 participants and a 27.8 percent turnout.

Longlac (2258 population) in 1985 had 465 participants and a 20 percent turnout. In 1986 they had 737 participants and a 32.6 percent turnout.

Geralton (2821 population) in 1985 had 420 participants and a 15 percent turnout. In 1986 they had 414 participants and a 14.6 percent turnout.

Nakina (900 population) in 1985 had 122 participants and a 14.3 percent turnout. In 1986 they had 133 participants and a 14 percent turnout.

Total Number of Participants: in 1986 there were 5482 participants, and in 1985 there were 4410 participants.
