# Terrace Bay placement office for students now open

Although its official opening won't take place until June 19, the Canada Employment Centre for Students in Terrace Bay and Schreiber is already open for business.

The Student Placement Officer for the area, 19-year-old Jacki Speziale of Schreiber, actually began work on May 31 after completing her first year in a four year psychology course at Lakehead University in Thunder Bay.

The main role of the centre will be to try and place students in summer jobs, Speziale explained. This will also take place in the 400 other centres in the country.

The Terrace Bay office,

which also has a sub-office open one day a week at the Schreiber Rec Centre, serves the entire area, including Pays Plat and Rossport. Manitouwadge, Nipigon, and Marathon have placement centres of their own. The Terrace Bay centre is located at the town Recreation Centre.

"The majority that reg-

ister at the centres are high school students," she said, adding that there is no age restriction for registration, as long as the person attended school last year and intends to return this fall. "We even get Grade 7

and 8 students," Speziale noted. As of June 11, there were 66 students registered at the local office, though she expects that number to increase over the next few weeks as high school students complete their year.

By the end of the summer last year, there were approximately 100 students registered at the local office, with roughly the same total expected for this year.

Speziale has already visited the area high schools and explained the centre's services to students looking for employment. She told them that when they come to the office they will get registed by filling out a card, which will be kept on

The card will specify such information as what the student hopes to get as a summer job and his or her past work experience.

The centre also features a Job Board, on which openings are posted, much like those seen at Unemployment Centres across Canada. Speziale explained that if there is a job on the board that a registered student is particularly interested in, they can ask about

"If they happen to qualify for the job, I'll give them a referral slip for it," Speziale said. "I'm here as a screen, in a way, to make everything go smoothly between the employer and the (job) applicant."

She finds most of the Job Board openings by canvassing the area employers either by phone or in person. Right now there are 25 openings on the Job Board, with many more expected to be posted over the next two months.

"A lot of the summer jobs don't start until July," she pointed out. "There will also be some casual jobs opening up for students to take the place of people going on vacation."

She said that most of the other positions are maintenance jobs, though there are also a lot of orders for babysitters, with a few jobs in sales, clerical, construction, and at the local MNR district office.

Casual work, which is defined as a position that lasts only five days or less, is also available. Speziale hopes to have all placements filled by the end of the program, scheduled to be completed in August.

The Terrace Bay office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays and from Wednesdays to Fridays. On Tuesdays, she visits Schreiber, and canvasses employers there.

is located in the MTC room at the Recreation Centre.

# Hazard exists

Owners of Toastess Waffler/Grill/Sandwich maker, Model 575 should stop using them immediately because of a potential shock hazard. The units concerned are stamped on the underside: Model 575, 120V, 1000W, Toastess Inc. No other models are affected.

Investigation has revealed that some units have an internal wire that may contact the heating surface, resulting in melting of the wire insulation and energizing the enclosure with 120 volts. In consultation with the Canadian Standards Association, Toastess Inc. is implementing a voluntary recall of all 24,100 units produced since July, 1985.

They will inspect the units in question and modify or replace, as may be required. Units should be carefully packaged and returned by Parcel Post to: Toastess Inc., 815 Tecumseh, Pointe Claire, Quebec,

H9R 4B1.

Please return the appliance with one set of grill plates installed; keep the cord and the other set of grill plates. Parcel post costs will be refunded by the manufacturer.

Modified and new units will be identified with the letter "A" printed after the model number on the carton, and on the underside of the product: (575A).
