Resolution about school taxes passed by Council

An article in "Municipal World" magazine inspired Terrace Bay Town Council to prepare and pass a resolution which, in part, calls for the government of Ontario to amend existing legislation so that every individual school board in the

province must collect its own taxes.

The article, Reeve Ollie Chapman noted, mentioned a Supreme Court of Ontario hearing held in London, Ontario on March 13 at which it was decided that a municipality may be required under the Education Act to pay over any interest earned or late payment penalties charged on amounts collected to a school board for which it collects taxes.

After reading about the case, Reeve Chapman and

the rest of Council decided to take some sort of action to prevent the local school boards from using the court decision to collect such funds. A resolution was then prepared, and was resd for the first time at the June 9 meeting of Council.

Clerk-treasurer Larry Simons gave an example of the sort of effect the court decision might have in Terrace Bay.

"If we pay the school board a tax requisition in March but actually collect the taxes in April, any penalties or interest are the property of the school board," he explained.

"The judge in the case was saying the municipality is a trustee and agreed with the school board," he added. "Obviously we are opposing this...the judge

Simons said Council's resolution is really a request to the provincial government to "short circuit this whole case" with an amendment to the Education Act. The London case is now under appeal.

He also pointed out the municipality has to give such money to the boards, whether it is collected or

"They can't have it both ways," Councillor George Ramsay said. He agreed that if the resolution is also passed later this week by the Thunder Bay District Municipal League at its meeting in Schreiber that it should also be sent to the Association of Ontario Municipalities (AMO) for approval as well.

The resolution was then put to a vote and it was passed unanimously.

The motion points out that municipalities are already required under the Education Act to pay over to the school board a fixed portion of the board's annual requisition, even if the

taxes have yet to be collected.

"It is desirable that the agency collecting taxes retain the right to interest and penalties to encourage efficient collection procedures and policies," the motion added.

It offered the provincial government three different choices, though all three would involve the amendment of the Education Act or some other legislation.

Copies of the resolution will be sent to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and the Minister of Education.

Reeve Chapman will be attending the AMO meeting in Toronto this August in person to see the resolution through. She will also be there on behalf of Council's previous resolution on the Special Occasion Permits.

In that motion, Council called for the province to change the existing laws so that the responsibility for the safety and sobriety of patrons at a licenced event lie with the holders of the permit and not the owners of the building where the function is being held, as is currently the case.


