At one point, a total donation of \$1,000 had been considered by Council, but

after some discussion it was decided to keep the donation at \$750 total.

Council also supported a motion from the United

Transportation Union to keep the caboose and rear crews on freight trains. Both national railways are planning to replace their cabooses with the End of Train Information System.

"I have struggled with this," Councillor George Ramsay admitted. "I don't know what to do with this ... I've covered both sides and I still don't know."

Councillor Peter Romanuk explained that Canadian Pacific Rail had put on a demonstration of the ETIS at a recent meeting of the Thunder Bay Municipal League, but even after seeing it, he said he still supports the caboose system.

"I don't know if the caboose on the end of a train is of any real value," Ramsay replied. The UTU

motion was then put to a vote and it passed with a majority in favour.

A request from Cheryl Hodgins to tape record future Council meetings was referred to the township's lawyer after a consensus could not be reached at the meeting.

"I'm still in favour of this (request)" Councillor Chris Joubert said.

"I was opposed to it before and I still am," Romanuk responded. The issue had been raised originally at the previous Council meeting.

"The thing with tape recorders is that you have to have permission from everyone present," Reeve Chapman explained. "If there's even one objection, it can't be used."

Reeve Chapman admitted that she is "not too keen" on the idea of tape recorded meetings herself, and suggested Council receive input from its lawyer before passing any motion on the matter.

A number of quotations for overhead door replacement at the town Fire Hall were opened at the meeting and a motion was prepared and passed which accepted the quotation from Northern Engineering and Supply Company of Thunder Bay. The quote, for three overhead doors plus electrical work, was \$13,911.

Councillor Jim Ziegler reminded Council that it had only budgeted \$10,000 for the project.

"Where are we going to get the extra money for this?" he asked.

"The fire budget is always an 'if' thing," Ramsay replied. The motion accepting the quote was then put to a vote and carried.

There will be a second attempt to test the town's emergency siren on August 22, after the first try did not go off as scheduled earlier this month. Council was told that Kimberly-Clark had not been instructed to conduct the test the first time.

Reeve Chapman later told Council there will be a meeting on September 18 with the Assistant Deputy Minister of Northern Affairs and Mines. It had originally been scheduled for September 13. Doug Melville of the Ministry's office in Thunder Bay told the *News* that the meeting will be a closed one.

Council was also scheduled to meet with officials from the Winston Lake zinc mine project this week. The mine, which is to go into production next year, is located northwest of Schreiber. It will employ up to 150 workers. It is expected that some of those future employees will live in Terrace Bay.
