## Teachers attend meeting

Sandy Quinton was the Schreiber area's representative at the annual meeting of the Federal of Women Teachers' Associations of Ontario held last month, at which the group discussed class sizes and school nurses.

A resolution passed at the meeting urged the Ontario Ministry of Education to make a strong commitment to primary education and reduce class sizes in the earliest school years.

The group's campaign to reduce class size is based on research showing that smaller classes are particularly beneficial in the early grades.

The Federation represents the 32,000 women

who teach in public elementary schools in the province.

Delegates at the annual meeting also heard that school nurses are doing less and classroom teachers and other school staff are doing more to care for the physical needs of children as a result of budget cuts in the public health sector.

The teachers voted to lobby the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of

Education to make sure that adequate health services are provided in the schools.

Gail Conrad-Davey, in charge of public relations for the Lake Superior Women's Teachers' Association, sent out a copy of a Federation release.

In the release, the Federation noted that it had prepared a report showing that although more women are being promoted to principals since government

grants began two years ago, more affirmative action programs are needed.

Although women make up 68 per cent of public elementary teachers, they make up only 10 per cent of principals, the release added.
