

Jamboree scheduled

Besides playing ringette, the girls will also have an action-packed weekend as they will be learning the skills of curling, courtesy of the Schreiber Curling Club, as well as floor hockey at the Lake Superior High School Schreiber campus. Fun activities at the Schreiber Recreation Complex will also be provided.

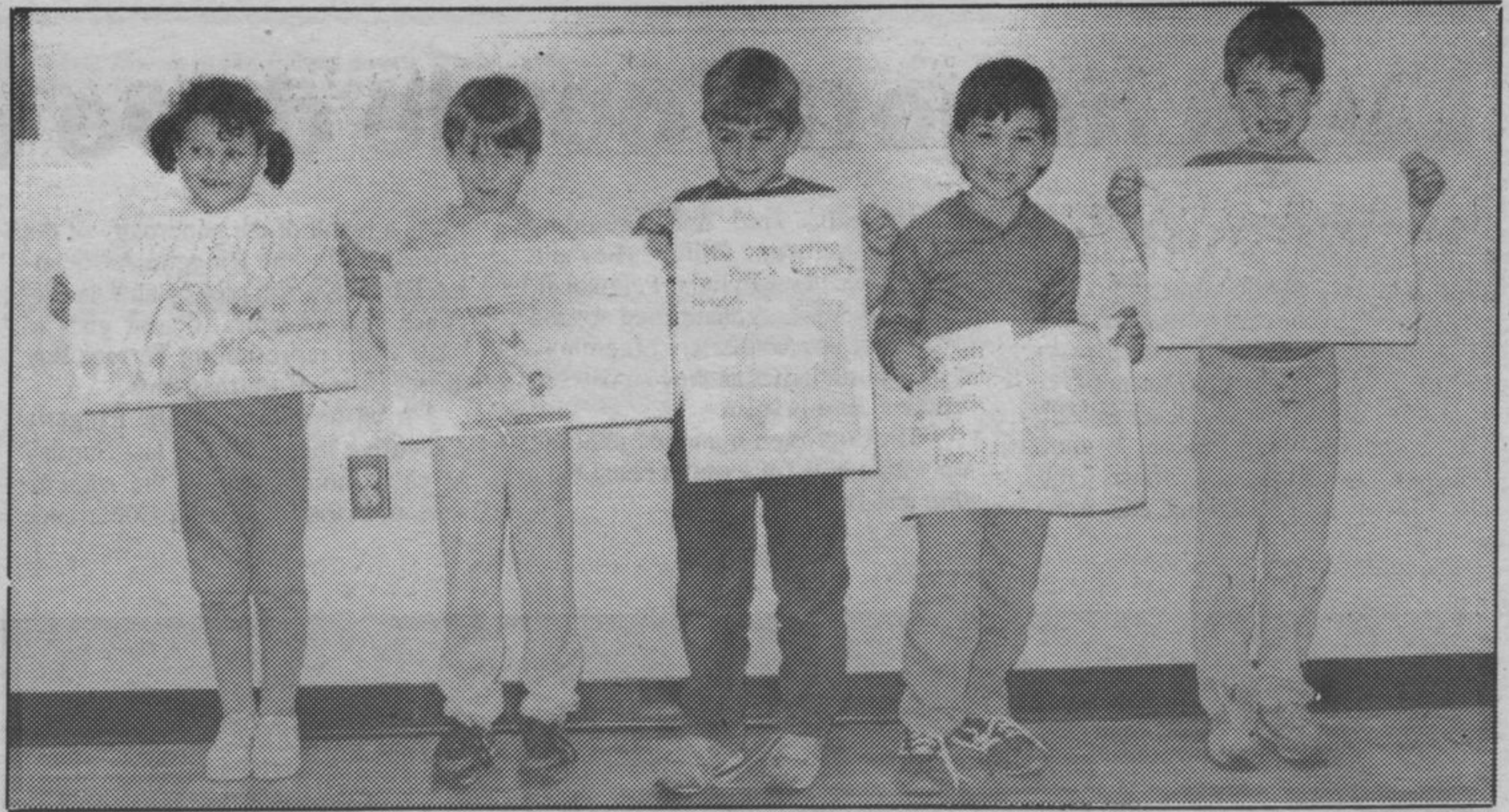
A supper will be held for the girls on Saturday evening at the Schreiber Complex Hall. A meeting of the North Shore Ringette Association will be held on Saturday night as well.

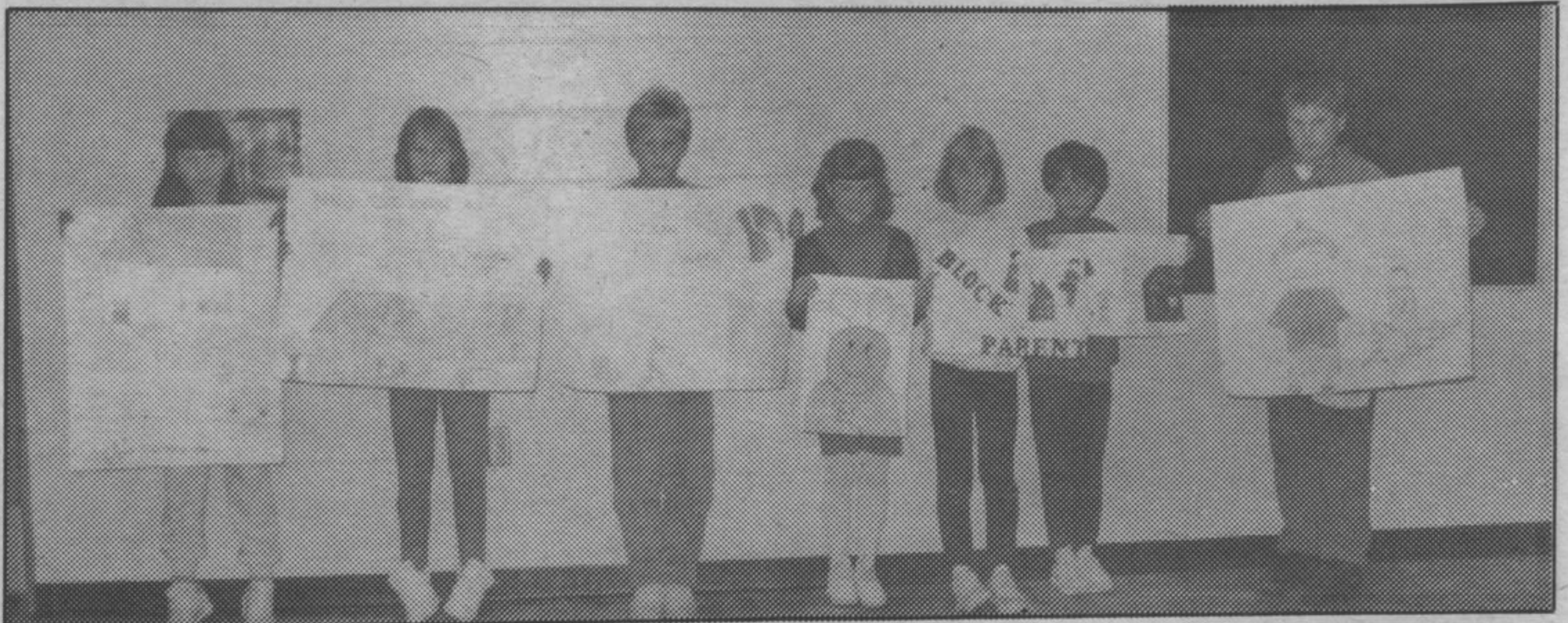
