Chapman had some trouble with that reply. Who is this group? she asked Simons. He replied that they don't exist as a group but they're out there.

Simons added that a feasibility study is needed before the project can get the go-ahead, but said he does not know if there will be one.

Council has received and agreed to support a resolution from the City of Brampton asking for its support in requesting the government of Ontario to allocate funds for recreational and cultural projects in an amount equal to Wintario and Lottario profits, or alternatively, sufficient to finance all eligible grant applications.

Outcries such as this one are the result of the government's decision to end the dedication of lottery funds for specific recreation and arts programs.

Clerk Simons received a letter from Premier Peterson dated Oct. 14 which stated: "...be assured that this change (lottery amendment) does not reflect any lessening of the Government's commitment to recreation and cultural programs".

Council also discussed whether plans should be made for another Canada Day celebration. It was agreed that there will be because as Councillor Chris Joubert said, "It's one day that the town should go all out. It didn't cost much and people really enjoyed it last year," he said.

The next joint meeting of the Terrace Bay and Schreiber Councils on Dec. 1 will begin with a dinner at the Red Dog Inn starting at 6 p.m.

The first joint meeting held in late September in Schreiber began with dinner so council believe it is only fair to return the favor.

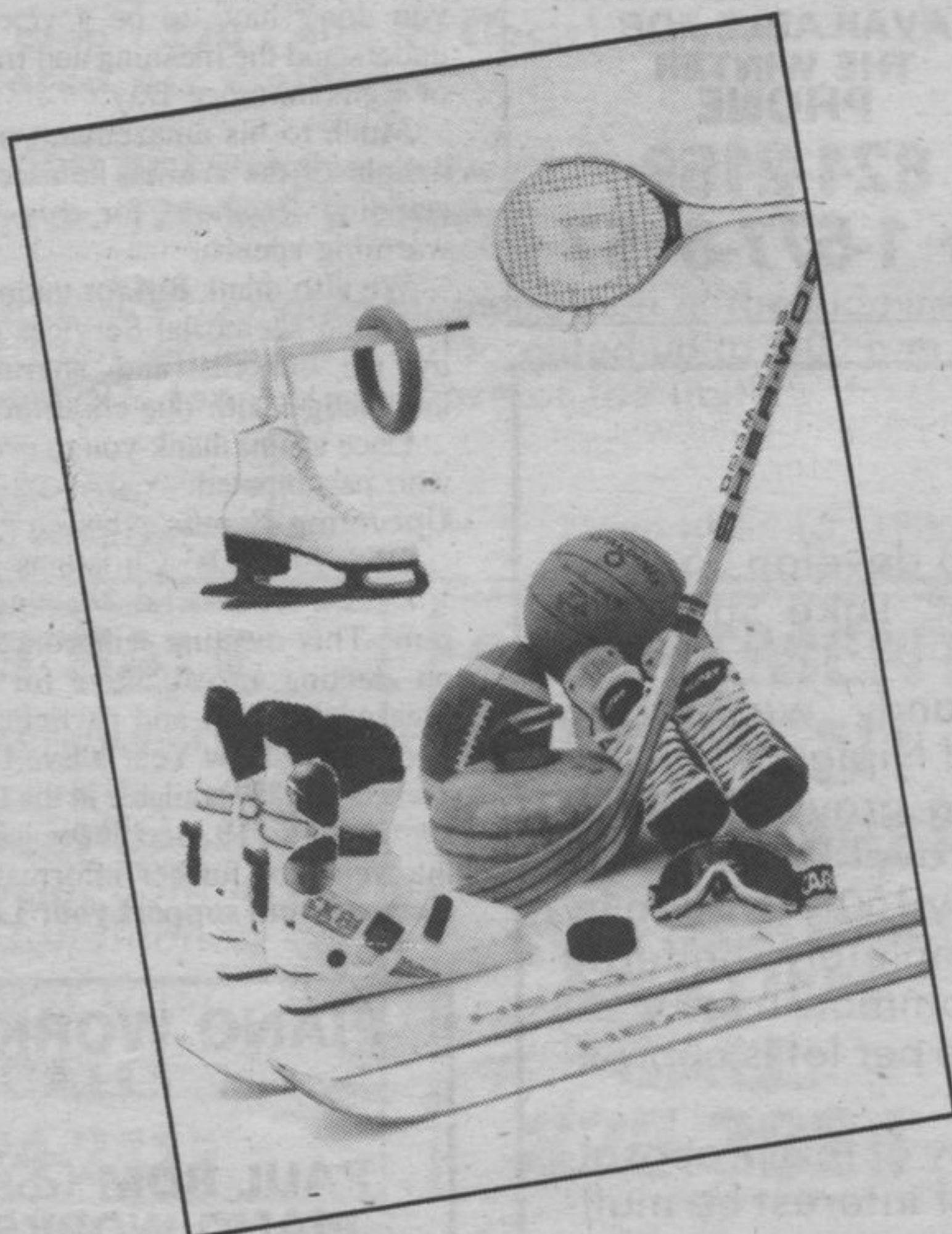
