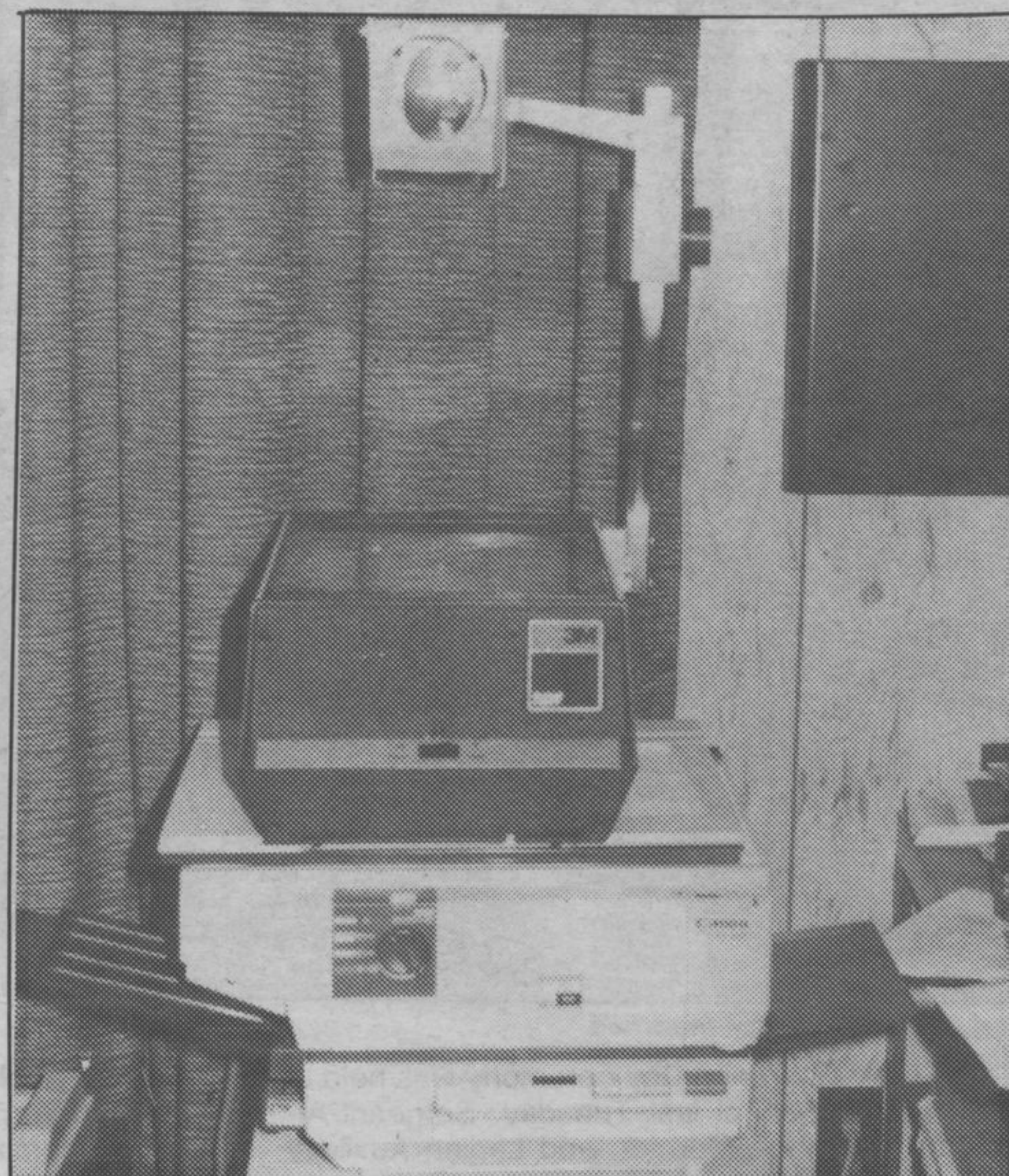

This overhead projector is now at the Terrace Bay Police Force and is for use by anyone in the community. A Wintario grant helped pay for half of its purchase price.

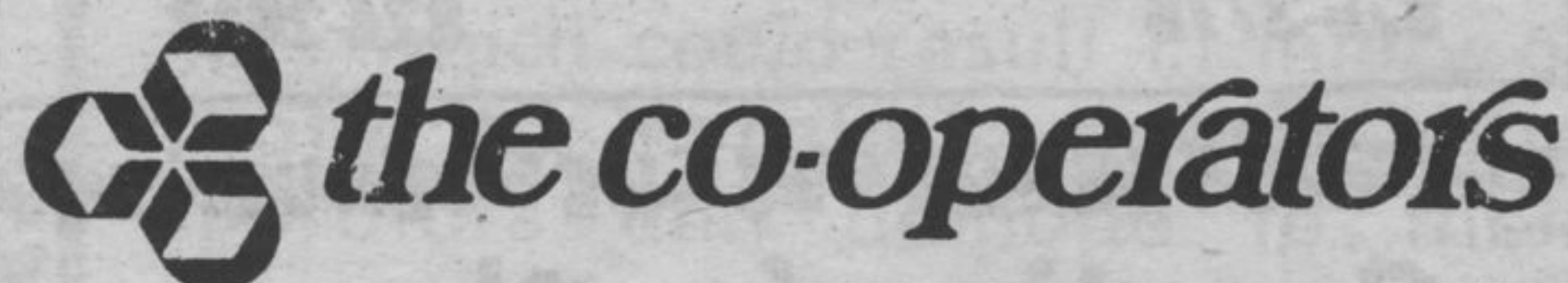

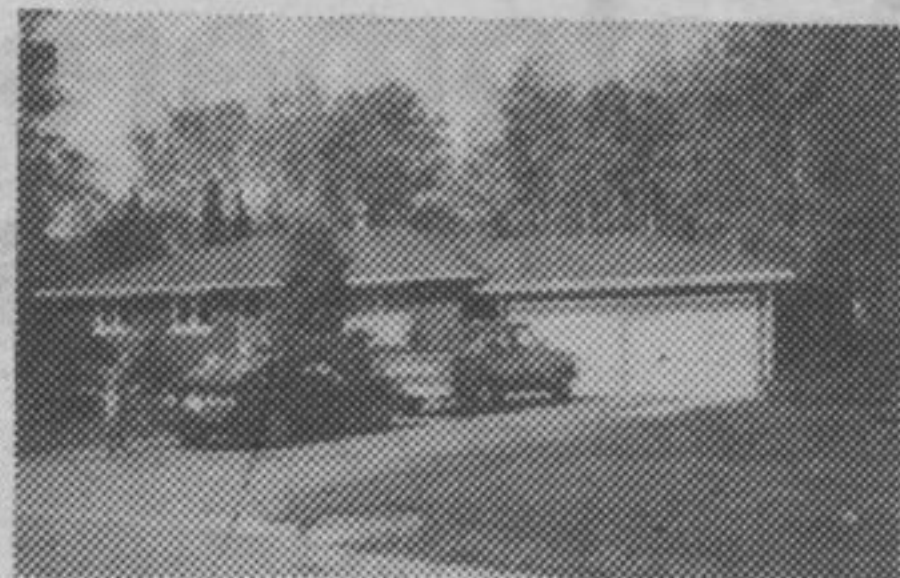
