

# Make chocolate bears from homemade bread

Homemade breads are a Christmas delight especially when they are shaped into whimsical forms such as this chubby, cheerful bear.

This edible, eye-catching bear is a moist, chocolate-laden yeast bread that is sure to add cheer to a festive table.

You might want to make some extra 'bears' for holiday gifts from your kitchen.

Chocolate Christmas Bears are made with Fleischmann's Fast Rising Active Dry Yeast.

This yeast is dissolved in warm water (110 F- 40 C) and sugar before it is added to the dry ingredients.

It will foam when mixed with the water and sugar indicating that it is ready for use.

- Chocolate Christmas Bears**
- ¼ cup warm water (110 F- 40 C)- 50 mL
  - 2 tsp. granulated sugar- 10 mL
  - 1 (8g envelope) Fleischmann's Fast Rising Active Dry Yeast- 1
  - ¾ cup milk- 175 mL
  - ¼ cup margarine- 50 mL
  - 1 cup water- 250 mL
  - 1 tsp. salt- 5 mL
  - ¼ cup granulated sugar- 50 mL
  - 1 ½ cups semi-sweet chocolate chips, divided- 375 mL
  - grated rind of one orange
  - 6 cups all-purpose flour- 1500 mL

Combine warm water and 2 tsp. (10 mL) sugar in a large bowl; add Fleischmann's Fast Rising Active Dry Yeast and let stand until foamy, about

10 minutes.

Heat and stir milk, margarine, water, salt, sugar and 1 cup (250 mL) chocolate chips just until margarine and chocolate start to melt; cool if necessary to lukewarm.

Add to yeast mixture; add orange rind and 3 ½ cups (875 mL) flour; beat until smooth with electric mixer or by hand.

Set aside three to five chocolate chips.

Stir in remaining chocolate chips and enough of remaining flour to make a soft dough that does not stick to the bowl.

Turn out on a lightly floured board, knead until smooth and elastic about 8 to 10 minutes.

Place in a greased bowl, turning to grease the top.

Cover with plastic wrap and place bowl on a baking sheet over a shallow pan half-filled with boiling water; let rise until doubled in bulk about 45 to 60 minutes.

Punch dough down and turn out on

to lightly floured board and knead three to four times.

Divide dough into four equal pieces; form two pieces into smooth round balls for bodies of bear and place each in the centre of a greased baking sheet; flatten slightly.

Break off a one-inch (2.5 cm) piece from each of the remaining pieces; roll into balls and position on heads for noses.

Divide each piece of remaining dough into six equal pieces; shape two for arms, two for ears and two for paws.

Place in correct positions and tuck

slightly under the body and head pinching edges together.

Cover with greased wax paper and place over a shallow pan half-filled with boiling water; let rise until puffy about 40 to 50 minutes.

Place a chocolate chip in position for each eye and one to three chocolate chips for belly button; press down lightly.

Bake at 350 F- 180 C for 20 to 25 minutes.

Leave on baking sheet for 10 minutes and then carefully slide off onto a wire rack to cool.

Makes two bear loaves.

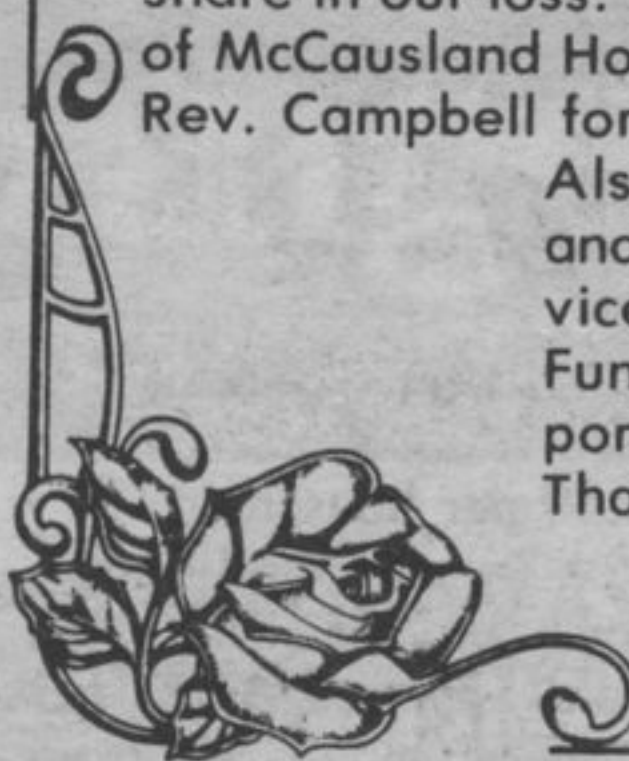

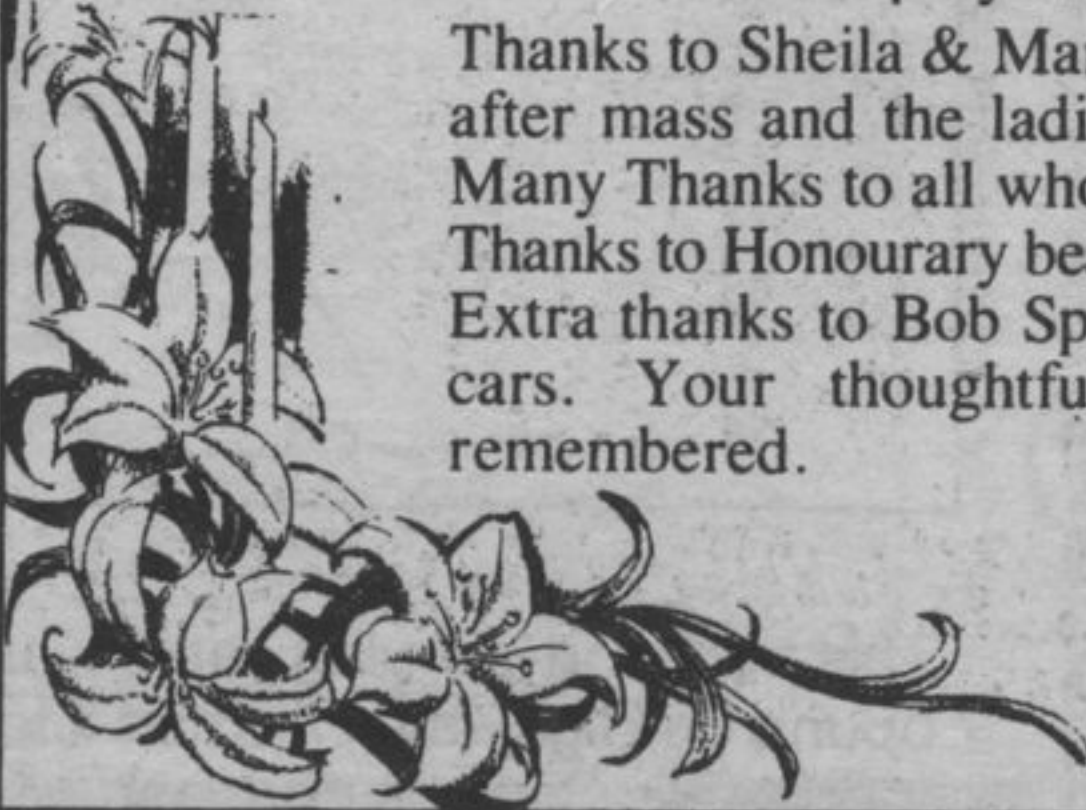
