

# Local green thumbs learn tricks

The Annual General Meeting of the Terrace Bay Horticultural Society was held on Monday, Oct. 27, in the multi-purpose room at the Recreation Centre.

There were 14 members and two visitors present.

The following officers and directors were elected: **President-** Hyacinthe Landry; **1st Vice-President-** Shirley Rippengal; **2nd Vice-President-** Teresa Landry, and **Secretary-** Jeannie Randle.

Kim Ten Hoeve will be continuing on as our treasurer.

Because some of our directors had to resign for personal reasons, and others were at the end of their elected term of office, we needed to elect eight directors.

The following people were elected: Randy Mercure, Anne Smrke and Taina Baker to serve for one year; Shirley Rippengal, Shirley Opas, Peter Monks and Walter Bigelow are currently serving two-year terms as directors.

Our auditors for 86/87 will be Mrs. Hubilit and Mrs. Wendy Landry.

## Guest speaker

After the business part of the meeting was concluded, we had a very interesting talk by John Soychak from Thunder Bay.

John is a horticultural landscape technician and his topic for the evening was the use of trees and shrubs in the landscaping of our gardens.

He gave us instruction on how to prepare our trees and shrubs for the

winter, i.e. soaking them well with water on warm, fall days so as to prevent winter spoilage from lack of water.

We were told that clearing away fallen pine needles, weeds, etc., from the trees in our yards and fertilizing around the root area or alternatively drilling small holes and putting the fertilizer in so that it can get to the roots of the tree more easily.

If you have grass around your trees, you should wait until the grass is dormant so that the tree gets maximum benefit from the fertilizer.

Wrapping tall cedars in burlap in winter helps to protect them, although they should not be tightly wrapped as this can damage instead of protect them.

Staking around bushes can also help to prevent snow damage.

John also pointed out that when clearing the snow from our paths or walkways, we should avoid throwing it on our bushes.

Although snow acts as insulation when it falls naturally, after being shovelled or blown it can freeze into solid blocks and cause damage to the plants.

We also talked on transplanting trees, how to prepare the ground, what fertilizer to use, spacing and placing for best effect and what to look for when buying them.

It is best to buy trees or shrubs that are grown for our area and not to expect something that grows in the "banana belt" to thrive up here.

Hints on pruning and what fertilizers work best for the root systems or the foliage and how often to fertilize were given.

The talk concluded with ideas of how best to keep our lawns in shape. John also had books and photographs for us to look at and get ideas for our own gardens and town centre.

The evening ended with thanks to John Soychak for his informative talk and to all those attending.

Doors prizes were drawn and the meeting closed with refreshments being served.

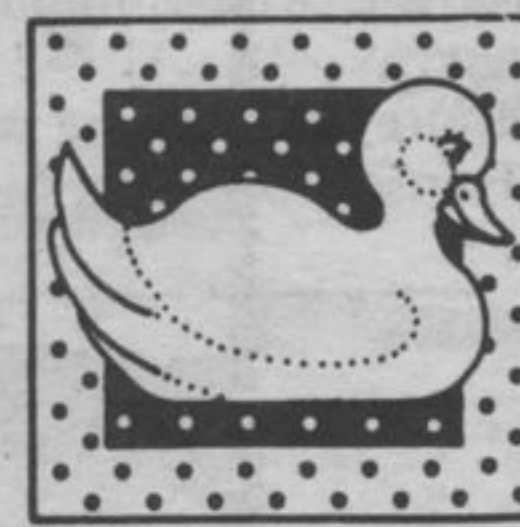
