We will leave you and the reindeers a treat.

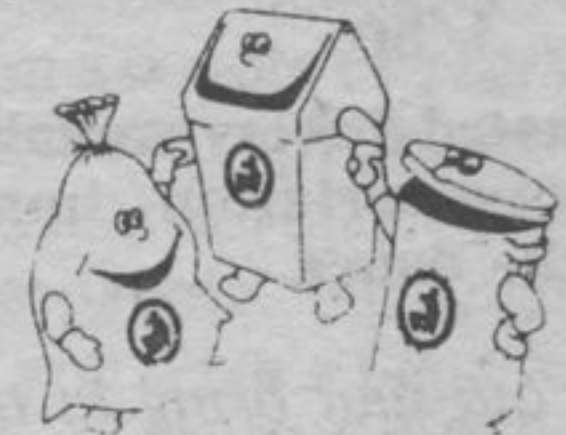
We all love you, Love Siobhan Falzetta, Terrace Bay.

munity cannot grow to be lighted towards the enlightenment of the Gospel."

I know where many have come from. I've been there, too, dashing into a Church twice a year for warmth and fellowship. It's good to be in the Church of your choice at Christmas or Easter... at least, you become conscious of the light of Christ.

But, so much is lost by not returning to the light regularly.

Children sometimes touch base with Christ far more profoundly than adults.

If they know the Lord Jesus as their personal Lord and Saviour, His light illuminates their knowledge of the Word and sacraments.

We adults sometimes shun from fellowship and worship for one reason... we fear being blinded by the light of Christ.

We can be blinded in many ways. We may have to recognize Christ wants more from us than a financial offering-He wants us.

Christ's life was "the light of men" and still is. We can't stay in the light of Christ's presence as part of a fellowship, without making a response... sometimes a response that means the Lord Jesus has to be first on our busy agendas.

Born again Christians

Christ's light also transforms and heals people who "have found religion" and become insufferable pushers of instant conversion.

Yet, we need to reckon that many "Born Again" Christians soon mature in their Faith, allowing God's Holy Spirit to direct them in their witness.

This year as you enter the Church of your choice, search out the Light of the World, Jesus Christ.

Look around at your neighbors and sense Christ's Light among you in His Word and sacrament.

Consider if you want to be enlightened by His Light to guide you through the Darkness of your life.

And, make no silly resolutions you can't keep... like "Father/Pastor/Reverend, I'm going to come every Sunday to service".

Decide to make a commitment for one Sunday at a time.

Accept the Light for what it brings-the opportunity to be enlightened by God's will for you in your life.

Above all, remember that darkness can be overcome in stages... by Christ's Light guiding you and your family through life.

DRAFT TIMBER MANAGEMENT PLAN - BIG PIC MANAGEMENT UNIT

A Draft Timber Management Plan has been completed for the Big Pic Management Unit. This Draft Plan outlines all areas eligible for harvest and regeneration for the twenty-year period 1987 to 2007 and specific areas for operations in the first five-year operating period. The Draft also outlines planned road locations and address the concerns of other users of the forest.

You are invited to review this Draft Timber Management Plan, the supplementary documentation (ie. record of public consultation; planning procedure for roads; and the planning procedure for harvest, renewal and maintenance operations in areas of concern) and MNR's preliminary list of required alterations to the plan.

The formal review of the draft plan will enable the public to:

- note how earlier submissions and comments on timber management proposals have been considered; and
- comment on the key decisions made in the draft plan.

The draft plan, supplementary documentation and list of required alterations are available for inspection at the Ministry of Natural Resources office in Manitouwadge, Manitou Road, telephone: 807-826-3225.

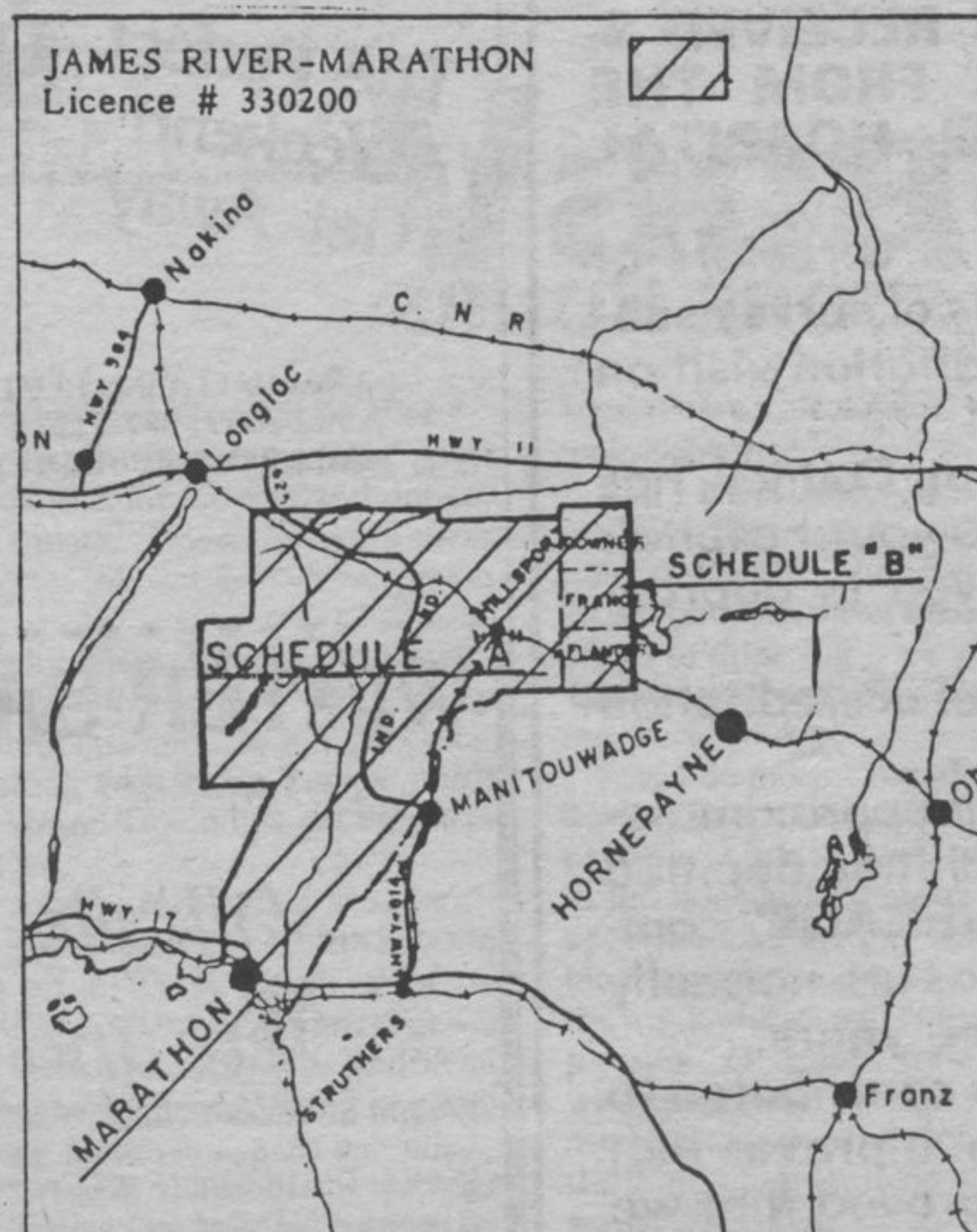
