Raisin Custard Pie

- 1 cup of raisins
- 3/4-cup white sugar
- 3 tbsp. cornstarch
- 3 eggs separated
- 2 tbsp. butter
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 baked 9-inch pie shell
- 3 heaping tbsp. icing sugar
- 1/2-tsp. vanilla

Cook the raisins in boiling water until tender. Drain and cool.

In heavy saucepan or double boiler mix white sugar and cornstarch with a small amount of cold water.

Add egg yolks and mix well. Add butter and 1 1/2 cups hot water-cook until thick, stirring constantly.

Stir in vanilla (1 tsp.) Cover bottom of pie shell with raisins; pour custard over raisins.

Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form. Add icing sugar and beat well. Add 1/2-tsp. vanilla. Spread over custard sealing to edges of crust.

Bake at 350 degrees until golden.

M.P.P. receives response from Fulton

Mr. Gilles Pouliot, M.P.P. Lake Nipigon Riding.

Dear Gilles:

In response to the proposal expressed in your letter of January 15, 1987, that the federal and provincial governments join forces to double the capacity of the Trans-Canada Highway between the community of Nipigon and the On-

tario/Manitoba boundary, I agree that an improved Highway 17 corridor would be economically beneficial at both the local and national levels.

In addition, it could prove to be a catalyst in attracting a greater number of tourists to Northern Ontario.

A bilateral agreement between the federal and provincial govern-

ments is essential for funding major interprovincial transportation initiatives, such as the Trans-Canada Highway.

As I stated in my letter of December 18, 1986, I have personally raised the issue of joint funding with the federal transport minister. I will continue to solicit his support for such a project.
