Andrea Stortini started her placement in the middle of February, and she performs secretarial duties such as typing and filing.

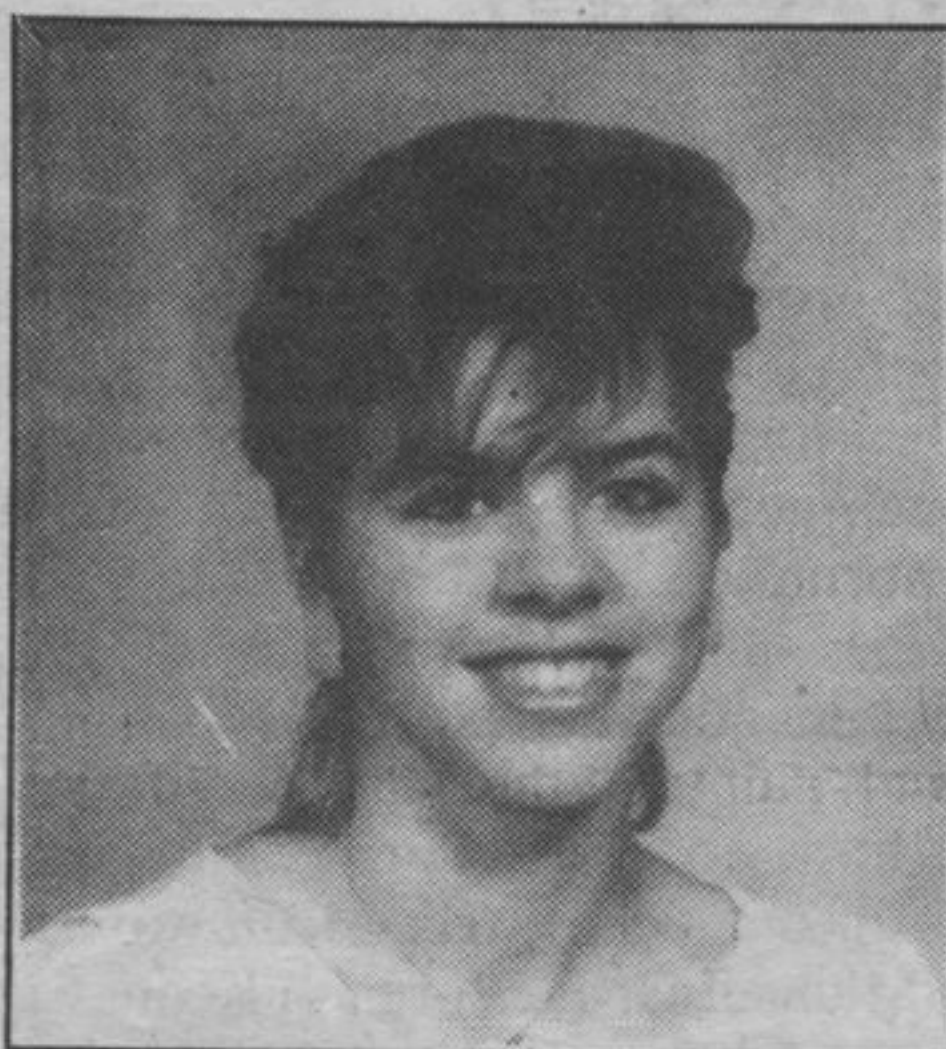
Andrea will continue her placement until she completes the required 150 hours of on-the-job training.
