## Highway 17 study finally initiated by minister

Dear Gilles

Thank you for your letter of January 22, 1987 which included a letter from Mr. V. Townsend, Chairman Occupational Health and Safety Committee, Domtar

Packaging, Red Rock, expressing concerns for the safety of those who travel Highway 11/17 between Ninimar and Thunder Bay and for the lack of noticeable improvements to the highway

network.

Let me just say that I am also concerned about the recent accident rate on this stretch of highway and would like to see it reduced. I realize this is a very important transportation link, for those who

work and shop in this area and in order to improve the safety, upgrading of this facility is required.

Since the Trans Canada Highway is aging and the original design no longer reflects its national importance, as stated in my previous correspondence, we have recommended that the Federal government give considertion to funding the upgrading of the Trans Canada route. To this end, I initiated a study to evaluate what is required in time and dollars to four-lane Highway 17 from the Manitoba/Ontario border to Ottawa. It is anticipated that the results of this study will be available by the middle of 1987.

In the interim, we will continue with the passing lane program

which provides for the construction of additinal lanes on this facility where safety and operational objectives indicate they would be most effective. The Ministry is also providing partial paved shoulders on all sections of Highway 11/17 and Highway 17, as particular section are rehabilitated.

In reference to Mr. townsend's concern for the lack of noticeable improvements to the highway, I am pleased to inform you that we will soon be tendering a project, in this vicinity, with construction to be carried out this summer. The rehabilitative work proposed will include some of the interim improvements as mentioned above. Yours Sincerely,
