Canada Day poster chosen

Ottawa- Gwendolyn Haevens, a seven year-old student from Cambridge Bay, Northwest Territories, has been chosen as the winner of the nation-wide Canada Day Poster Contest, Secretary of State David Crombie announced on May 7. (Several months ago the News ran the story announcing perons could enter this contest).

The winning national entry was selected from 12 provincial/territorial winners and will be printed and distributed across the country as the official poster for the 1987 Canada Day Celebrations.

As the grand prize winner, Gwendolyn and her immediate family will be the guests of the secretary of state for the Canada Day celebrations on Parliament Hill.

In honour of 1987 being the 40th anniversary of Canadian citizenship, the theme of the poster competition was "What It Means to be a Canadian."

The winning poster depicts the rich cultural fabric of the Canadian family.

"I think Canada means getting

together, being happy and helping each other," said Gwendolyn in her explanation of the theme.

The poster contest was open to Canadians of all ages in every region of the country. Approximately 6,000 entries were received from the 12 provinces and territories.

These preliminary winners were selected from each region before the final judging took place on March 19, 1987.

Each of the 36 finalists received a three-volume set of the Canadian Encyclopedia and the first-prize winners at the regional level were also given an engraved medallion commemorating their achievement.

"The artistic calibre of the entries, from both children and adults, was extremely high, " said Crombie. "Choosing the best from so many that seemed to come straight from the heart was extremely difficult."

.Corporate sponsorship of the contest came from The Bay and McDonald's, which used ther outlets across the country to help promote the event.


PUBLIC NOTICE TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER

Take notice that the Municipal Council of the Township of Schreiber will take into consideration the passing of, and if approved, will pass at its meeting to be held on the 9th day of June, 1987, or at an adjourned meeting thereof, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon, at the Council Chambers, Municipal Office, 608 Winnipeg Street.

A By-law to stop and close the public street or highway more particularly described as follows:
