
## NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A ZONING BYLAW BY THE TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER

TAKE NOTICE That the Council of the Township of Schreiber passed a By-Law 87-6 on the 12th day of May 1987 under Section 39 of the Planning Act, 1983.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-Law by filing with the Clerk of the Township of Schreiber, P.O. Box 40, Schreiber, Ont. P0T 2S0, not later than the 15th day of June 1987 a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the By-Law and the reasons in support of the objection.

An explanation of the purpose and effect of the By-Law, describing the lands to which the By-Law applies, and a key map showing the location of the lands to which the By-Law applies (or, alternatively, an explanation as to why a key map is not provided) are attached. The complete By-Law is available for inspection in my office during regular office hours.
