Ministry of Natural Resources extends a hearty thanks

Recent precipitation in the North Central Region has stabilized the forest fire situation.

"Not since 1980, when more than one million hectares of forest was consumed by fire, have we seen such explosive burning conditions," Paul Strassburger, district manager Terrace Bay district, said last Thursday.

The situation could have been much worse except for the co-operation of the forest and industrial operators, local tourist operators and the general public.

"Basically our people were just allowed to get on with the job and I think it demonstrates the awareness level of local people when it comes to a forest fire situation," said George Elliott, director, Ministry of Natural Resources, North Central Region.

Mopping up operations are underway and many tired firefighters have been released and are on their way home. Hoses, pumps, tents, tarps and cooking equipment are being trucked in to the regional fire centre in Thunder Bay for cleaning, repairing, drying and repacking for the next fire call.

We regret any inconvenience resulting from the imposed restrictions and closures. "I would like to express my sincere gratitude to all forest operators, tourist operators, and the general public in the Terrace Bay district," Mr. Strassburger said.

"We really appreciate the complete co-operation and supporting services during the extreme fire situation, and trust our shared concern over our forest resources will ensure our prosperous future," he said.

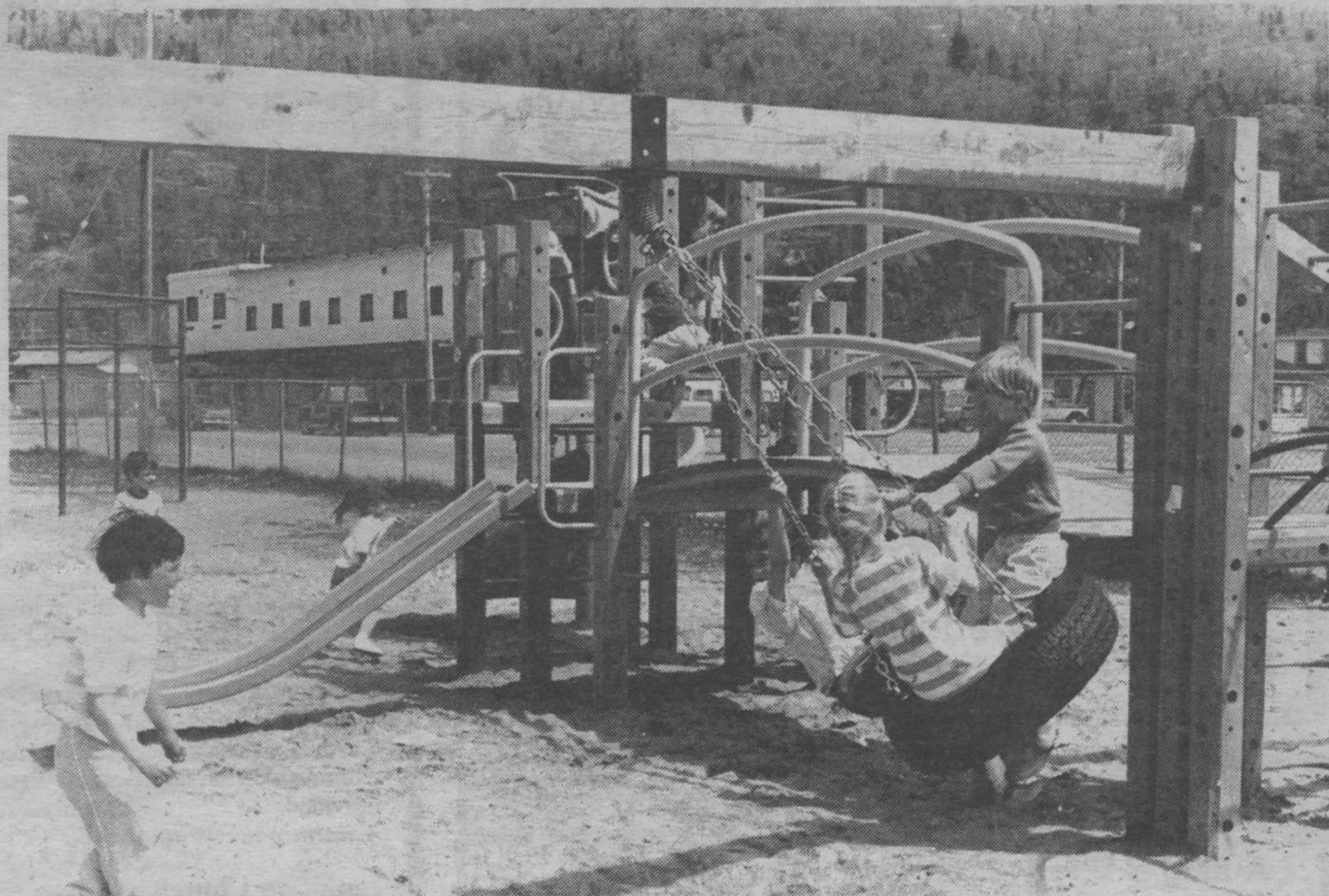
The plan must also "consider the financial ability of the community to provide culture/recreation services."

Schreiber Public School receives new playground

The Township of Schreiber and the Lake Superior Board of Education were pleased to co-operate to install new playground equipment at the Schreiber Public School.

The town had originally planned to install the equipment at Holy Angels Separate School. However, due to planned renovations at that school, a site could not be determined at this time. Holy Angels

playground will receive new equipment as soon as renovations have been completed.

The funding for the new equipment came from both the Township of Schreiber and the Lake Superior Board of Education as well as a matching grant from Wintario.

The unit is the latest in design and safety. This was a main consideration in choosing it. The apparatus will be used by students at Schreiber Public School during regular school days and is for public use at all other times.

The township and the board feel that this equipment is a welcome addition to the community of Schreiber.
