Home renewal program helps to improve your home

Ontario Home Renewal Program

This column will be of interest to homeowners living in the unorganized areas on the North Shore.

The Ontario Home Renewal Program (O.H.R.P.) offers homeowners living in their own properties an opportunity to make necessary improvements to their principal residence.

The program is aimed at rehabilitating substandard homes, with emphasis on faulty structural and sanitary conditions, as well as the upgrading of plumbing, insulation, heating and electrical systems.

In unorganized communities without municipal boundaries, O.H.R.P. is administered by the Ministry of Housing in conjunction with the Ministry of Northern Development and

Mines.

A system of loans, repayable and forgivable, to pay for the property rehabilitation is available to qualifying individuals whose "adjusted family income" does not exceed \$21,000 (effective April 1, 1987).

The maximum amount of the loan, repayable and forgivable is \$7,500. The forgivable portion of the loan is based upon family income and may not exceed \$4,000.

The interest rates charged range from 0 per cent to 10 per cent and are based upon family income.

Before proceeding with the work it is necessary that at least two written estimates of the

approved work be submitted by contractors willing to do the work.

Upon final approval and payment for work carried out the owner-occupant is required to make monthly payments on the loan.

A maximum of \$600 for each full year of occupancy can be forgiven.

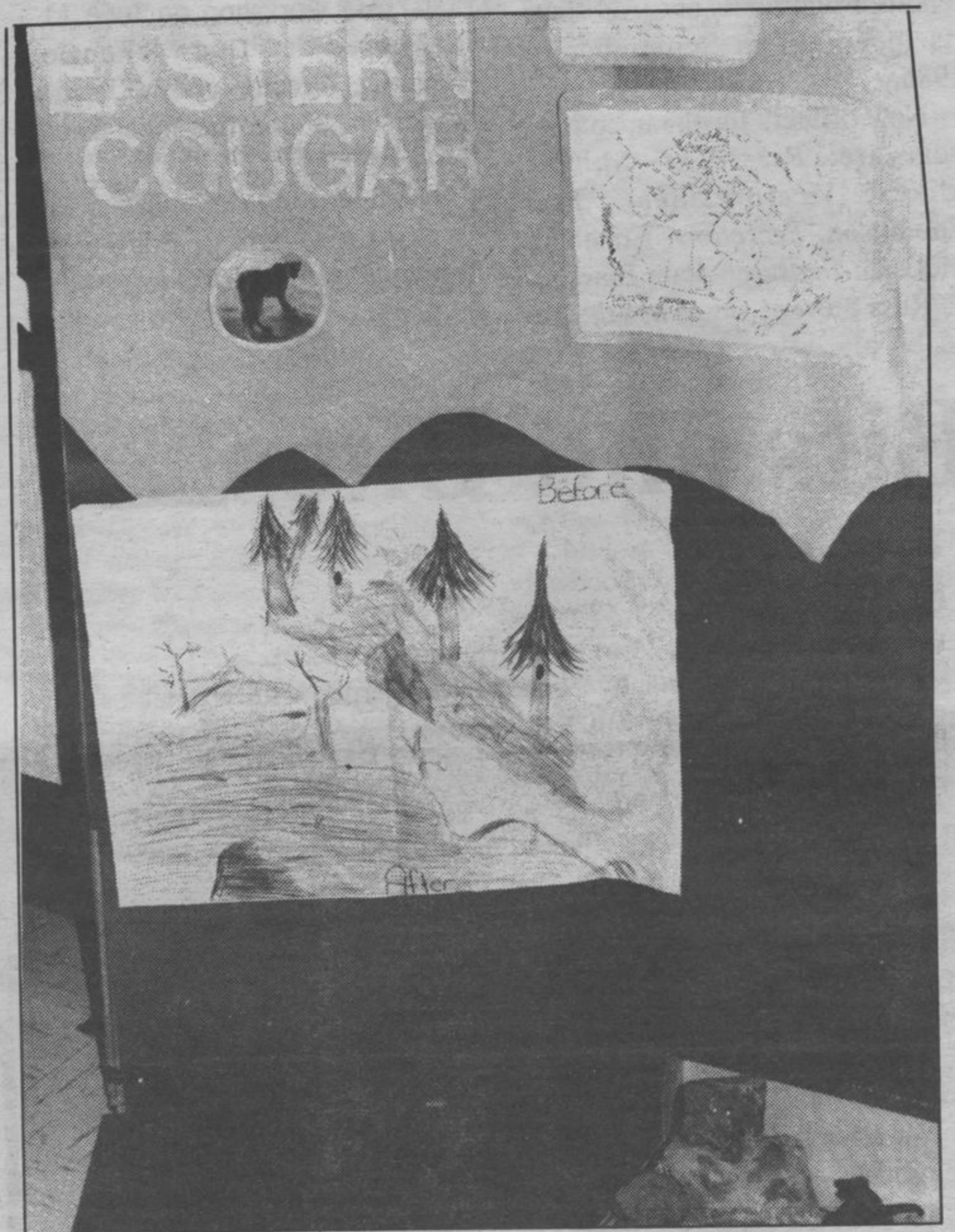
