Nature notes

Mother Nature offers the first of her vegetable garden's crop for our enjoyment.

The lowly dandelion is ready to serve in salads and wine. The roots can be boiled and chopped to add to various recipes for

salad.

My favourite recipe for dandelion salad is to add a bit of finely-chopped onion and serve with vinegar, oil and seasoning.

The bobbing yellow are flowers swaying in the strong winds but the leaves and stems are short for lack of rain unless they are growing near water.

The curled fiddleheads should

be ready to harvest. I've eaten the packaged ones from the freezer department of stores but they can't hold a candle to the fresh ones from the wilds. Butter, season to taste----OH BUT THEY ARE TASTY. Sometimes I add grated cheese, a marsh marigold, young cowslip. The buds and flowers are best used in May, otherwise, they become bitter.
