for the failure of the platform. "We will not use that (particular) platform again to finish the work (being done by the J. S. Redpath Company)" Dixon said.

Difficult situation

Dixon said that for Minnova Inc. it is "serious when anyone gets injured let alone killed".

In 1985 a Redpath employee was killed when an eight-foot ceiling fell and crushed him.

Dixon said that there have been no further incidents of rockfalls underground since that time.

Minnova Inc. continues to monitor serious rockfalls said Dixon, and a lot of work has been done with rock mechanics and rock reports.

Normal mining practices include having a safety person on site and regular meetings with crews.

Dixon said that an accident like this creates a difficult situa-
