This two-part article will provide some basic information which may help Ontario students with some of the most common questions asked.

On-the-job safety and minimum wages and working conditions in Ontario are governed by provincial and federal legislation. The Ontario law applies to most workers in the province.

Minimum wage

The minimum wage for students working in Ontario is \$3.50 an hour; this rate increases to \$3.70 beginning on October 1, 1987.

This applies to students under 18 who work 28 hours or less in a week or who work during school holidays.

A student 18 years or older must be paid the minimum rate of \$4.35 an hour. On October 1, 1987, the rate increases to \$4.55 an hour.

In construction, you must be at least 16 years-old or older depending on the type of work while in logging you must be 16 years-old or more.

In a factory other than a logging operation, you must be at least 15 years of age, and in a work place other than a factory you must be at least 14 years-old.

Students in general industry must be paid at least one-and-ahalf times their regular rate for all hours in excess of 44 hours in a week.

Special overtime provisions have been established for certain industries and students working in such industries shall be paid overtime rates for all excess hours based upon these conditions.

Qualified employers are entitled to seven public holidays with New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Good Friday,

Victoria Day, Canada Day, Labour Day and Christmas Day.

To qualify the worker must be employed three months immediately preceeding the holiday, earn wages on 12 days of the four weeks preceeding the holiday and work the regular work day preceeding and following the holiday.

Employees are entitled to vacation pay at the rate of four per cent of all monies earned.

No minimum period of employment is required for qualification.

Workers must receive written notice of termination of employment if they have been employed for three months or more.

The length of notice depends on the employee's length of service.

However, termination notice does not apply under certain conditions; including dismissal for wilful misconduct or disobedience or on the completion of a specific term or task for which the employee was hired.


