Education minister's trip cancelled last Saturday

What was supposed to be an endorsement of Liberal Candidate Herman Mannila by Education Minister Sean Conway was cancelled due to bad weather.

Mr. Conway was expected to arrive in Terrace Bay on Saturday, September 5, but he was fogged in in Sudbury, Ontario.

Mr. Conway had intended to come to Terrace Bay to endorse Manilla, Liberal Candidate for the Lake Nipigon Riding.

Conway was unable to attend a reception at the recreation centres

in Terrace Bay and Schreiber.

Prepared to respond

Fortunately, Manilla and his staff were prepared to discuss the issues in the clear and comprehensive manner which has characterized the Provincial Liberal campaign.

Manilla, who resides in Nipigon, Ontario, is concerned about the mass exodus of the younger generation from the North to the larger urban areas of the South, such as Toronto.

Kimberly-Clark sells its sawmill

Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited announced on Monday, August 31, that they have reached an agreement, in principle, to sell their Longlac sawmill to Lecours Lumber Company of Calstock, Ontario.

The final sale is contingent upon Lecours Lumber Co. Ltd. reaching agreements with the Ministry of the Environment for sawmill waste disposal, and the Lumber and Sawmill Workers' Union for labour contracts.

Timber allocations to supply the sawmill from the Kimberly-Clark timber licence area will be determined by the Ministry of Natural Resources with consideration for Kimberly-Clark's and other companies' requirements.

Lecours Lumber Co. Ltd. will produce most of the Longlac sawmill log requirements, harvesting under Third Party Agreements.

The balance of the log supply would be produced from Kimberly-Clark cutting operations, exchanging 16-foot logs for 8-foot pulpwood produced from Lecours' cutting operations.

Kimberly-Clark closed the Longlac sawmill on May 15, 1987, laying off 61 sawmill employees.
