Chapman, reeve of Terrace Bay, re: Program for Renewal, Improvement, Development and Economic Revitalization (PRIDE)- Application for the 1987-88 Program Year- The review of municipal applications for funding under PRIDE for the 1987-88 program-year has now been completed, and I am pleased to inform you that the Township of Terrace Bay has been allocated \$120,000 by the Province of Ontario.

In view of the limited availability of program dollars, the funds under PRIDE should be directed toward strategic improvements which achieve both provincial and municipal objectives.

My staff will be contacting your staff in the immediate future to assist in the identification of these critical project components and to discuss detailed aspects of program administration.

It should be noted that no money can be spent on the implementation of the PRIDE proposal until the requisite community improvement plan has been approved.

BC 301 Basic Bookkeeping in Schreiber and Terrace Bay

This course is designed to help the student learn how to:

- 1) Understand and set up a balance sheet and income statements;
- 2) Analyze transactions and identify names of accounts to be debited and credited;
- 3) Journalize, post and take a trial balance using single journal and single ledger systems;
- 4) Analyze trial balances and make necessary adjustments;
- 5) Construct 8-column worksheets;
- 6) Journalize and post adjusting closing and reversal entries using the worksheets;
- 7) Complete sales, purchase & cash disbursement journals and cash receipts.
- 8) Analyze transactions and keep records using multi-journal and three-ledger systems.

This course is scheduled for Thursday night from 7-10 p.m. at the Terrace Bay High School. BC 301 will commence on September 17, 1987, and is scheduled for completion on March 17, 1988. The instructor is Mr. Murray Becotte, CA Bachelor Comm. Fees are \$93.75.
