*verify in advance that the terminals you'll be using have the services you need. Have the bus line notify ticket agents along your route so they expect your arrival;

*if getting on and off the bus is difficult, take food and beverages along so you don't have to leave the vehicle unnecessarily;

*several major carriers have special programs which allow a disabled person to travel with a companion who can provide assistance.

Both people travel on the same ticket. Check with the bus lines for details.

If you travel by ship

* cruise ships have different degrees of accessibility. Ask about the ship's structure, particularly width of doorways, size of cabins and bathrooms plus accessibility of dining and recreation areas;

*if you have a wheelchair, check about any restrictions. For example, some cruise lines require wheelchairs to be no more than a certain width or to be collapsible. Some ships and islands do not permit motorized wheelchairs;

*some ships' anchor offshore at certain ports. Be sure there are facilities to get you from the ship to the launch, and then to shore;

*if you have never been on a cruise, consider a short "test the water" trip before you book a long ocean voyage. A weekend on the water will give you a good feel for ship travel and how you tolerate it.




