## Rescue attempt proves unnecessary

The Schreiber detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police report that although an attempt to rescue a man from Lake Superior was undertaken, he really did not want to be saved.

On Tuesday, October 27, 1987, a man was spotted on a rock on Lake Superior near Jackfish by Canadian Pacific Rail crewmen. The crewmen contacted the detachment and Constables Rolland and Crowder responded.

Police learned the man on the rock had been waving his arms and then disappeared from sight.

Constables Rolland and Crowder went to the sight where the man was seen. It was learned the he worked for a Burlington, Ontario, company that was conducting a survey in the area and the arm waving was in fact hand signals because of the absence of radio equipment.

Police stopped the search, the CP crewmen were thanked for their assistance and the police officers went on to other tasks.
